WHEREAS, California suffers from some of the worst air pollution in the country with the most affected area being the Central Valley; and,

WHEREAS, In addition to increased highway congestion, the influx of millions of new cars will impact our nation's already dwindling fuel supplies; and,

WHEREAS, In order to meet future transportation needs without high-speed rail California will need to build 3000 new miles of highway lanes, 60 new airline gates and five additional runways; and,

WHEREAS, California's population is projected to increase by 10 million people by the year 2020; and,

WHEREAS, California's transportation infrastructure is already extended beyond capacity; and,

WHEREAS, A trip from San Francisco to Los Angeles by bullet train would travel at 220 miles per hour and take two and a half hours, carrying over 100,000 passengers daily; and,

WHEREAS, High-speed rail would reduce the number of daily car trips through the Central Valley by the thousands, thereby significantly reducing emissions from vehicles and fuel consumption; and,

WHEREAS, Any plans to alleviate current congestion that do not take projected population growth into consideration are a stop-gap and short-sighted approach to an imminent transportation and ecological disaster; and,

WHEREAS, Efforts to secure funding for a high-speed rail system will require strong leadership and a willingness to plan for future generations of Californians; and,

WHEREAS, Governor Schwarzenegger's \$222 billion public works bond includes no funding for high-speed rail; and,

WHEREAS, Building a high-speed rail system is projected to cost \$33 billion; and, WHEREAS, The first \$10 billion of the project could be funded by a proposed bond

measure to be placed on the November ballot; now, therefore be it,

RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco urges Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger and Senator Don Perata to support placing the \$10 billion bond measure to fund a high-speed rail system between San Francisco and Los Angeles on the November, 2006 ballot; and, be it
