[Grant funds to improve and expand substance abuse treatment services.]

 Resolution authorizing the San Francisco Department of Public Health (DPH) to retroactively accept and expend a grant from the California Department of Alcohol and Drug Programs' (DADP) Comprehensive Drug Court Implementation (CDCI) in the total amount of \$713,132, with a local general fund match of \$142,627, for a budget total of \$855,759 to improve and expand substance abuse treatment services for adult felon drug court clients; for the period of January 1, 2007 through December 31, 2008.

WHEREAS, DPH was awarded a grant from DADP in the amount of \$713,132 (\$302,568 in year one and \$410,564 in year two) requiring a local general fund match in the amount of \$142,627 (\$60,514 in year one and \$82,113 in year two) for a budget total of \$855,759 for the period of January 1, 2007 through December 31, 2008; and,

WHEREAS, For the past seven years DPH has received CDCI funds for substance abuse treatment services for adult and juvenile drug court programs with participants in these programs instructed by criminal courts to receive substance abuse services; and,

WHEREAS, This CDCI grant provides funding for the Drug Court Treatment Center and the Youth Treatment and Education Center (YTEC), a program administered by the Unified Family Court, a division of the Superior Court of California, County of San Francisco; with the entire grant amount used to enhance existing contracts to YTEC and the Asian American Recovery Services (AARS); and,

WHEREAS, this project requires that funds be administered by the San Francisco County Alcohol and Drug Program Administrator, which is located within DPH; and,

WHEREAS, As a condition of receiving the grant funds, California DADP requires the City to enter into an agreement (the "Notice of Grant Award"), a copy of which is on file with

the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 080045; which is hereby declared to be a part of this resolution as if set forth fully herein; and,

WHEREAS, The grant does not require an ASO amendment because staffing is exclusively through the sub-contractors; and,

WHEREAS, Retroactive approval is being requested with a start date of January 1, 2007 because the funder increased amounts and due to delays processing contract documents; and,

WHEREAS, The Department does not include indirect costs in the grant budget as it is not allowed by the granting agency; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That SFDPH is hereby authorized to retroactively accept and expend a grant in the amount of \$713,132 from DADP; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives inclusion of indirect costs in the grant budget, and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That SFDPH is hereby authorized to accept retroactively and expend the grant funds in accordance with the requirements set forth in the Notice of Grant Award, pursuant to San Francisco Administrative Code Section 10.170-1.
