

[Supporting California Senate Bill 1225 Regarding Child Care Facilities]

Resolution supporting Senate Bill 1225 which would extend until 2016 the subsidy program that allows San Francisco child care facilities to serve children from low-income families.

WHEREAS, Child care services support a vast number of low-income families in the form of early childhood education, a service that is crucial for low-income families trying to maintain employment or attend school; and

WHEREAS, The loss of state subsidized child care provisions for working families would be devastating to the City's economy; and,

WHEREAS, San Francisco receives about \$57 million from the state for subsidized child care to serve 6,587 children, the need for this programming is further confirmed by the additional 4,000 eligible on the waiting list; and,

WHEREAS, San Francisco Unified School District serves over 4,600 children with the subsidy – without the subsidy program, San Francisco schools would lose a staggering \$4 million which would reduce the number of child development services; and,

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 1225 would increase eligibility for subsidized child care and sustain the child care program's ability to provide for higher contract reimbursement rates; and,

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 1225 would extend the San Francisco subsidized child care program until 2016; now, therefore, be it

1 RESOLVED, That Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco supports
2 Senate Bill 1225 to allow San Francisco to continue to provide child care services to more low-income
3 families in need; and, be it

4 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Clerk of the Board shall send this resolution to the California
5 State legislature to advise the legislature of the San Francisco Board of Supervisors support for Senate
6 Bill 1225.




