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3 **Resolution authorizing the Department of Emergency Management, for the City and**
4 **County of San Francisco as fiscal agent for the Bay Area region, to retroactively accept**
5 **and expend a FY2008 Buffer Zone Protection Program grant in the amount of \$579,090**
6 **from the U.S. Department of Homeland Security through the California Emergency**
7 **Management Agency to fund critical planning and infrastructure protection needs.**

13 WHEREAS, The Buffer Zone Protection Program (BZPP) is a targeted infrastructure
14 protection program that provides grant funds to build security and risk-management
15 capabilities at the State and local levels that will help protect critical infrastructure from acts of
16 terror; and,

17 WHEREAS, For the Fiscal Year 2008 BZPP program, DHS identified three sites in the
18 Bay Area region for award of grant funding for infrastructure protection activities; and,

19 WHEREAS, The San Francisco Police Department, in conjunction with Federal
20 Security Advisors, conducted site assessments as a critical element in the BZPP grant award
21 process; and,

22 WHEREAS, Upon completion of these assessments, the San Francisco Police
23 Department submitted a Buffer Zone Plan (BZP) and Vulnerability Reduction Purchasing Plan
24 (VRPP) for each of the funded sites; and,

25 WHEREAS, DHS must approve the BZP and VRPP before procurement and
implementation of projects designated in the VRPP can begin at each proposed site; and,

1 WHEREAS, The DHS and CalEMA (formerly the Office of Homeland Security)
2 approved the BZP and VRPP for the three Bay Area sites on April 30, 2010; and,

3 WHEREAS, San Francisco, as fiscal agent for the FY 2008 BZPP grant, will expend
4 \$227,627 to develop emergency plans and procedures, \$334,090 to purchase critical security
5 equipment for the three designated sites, and retain \$17,373 for management and
6 administration of the grant; and,

7 WHEREAS, Funds received must be expended no later than May 31, 2011, unless an
8 extension is granted; and,

9 WHEREAS, The grant does not require an ASO amendment; and,

10 WHEREAS, The grant does not include any provisions for indirect costs; now,
11 therefore, be it


12 RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the
13 Department of Emergency Management (DEM) to retroactively accept and expend a FY 2008
14 BZPP grant in the amount of \$579,090 from the Department of Homeland Security (DHS)
15 through the CalEMA to fund critical planning and infrastructure needs as provided in the
16 award; and, be it



17 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the DEM Executive Director, or designee, is authorized
18 to furnish whatever additional information or assurances the DHS or CalEMA may request in
19 connection with this grant, to execute any and all agreements or other documents, and to take
20 any other steps necessary to accept, distribute and expend the grant funds; and, be it

21 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the grant does not include any provisions for indirect
22 costs, and indirect costs are hereby waived.
