120241 [Planning Code - Establishing Three Outer Sunset Neighborhood Commercial Districts]

Sponsor: Chu

Ordinance amending the San Francisco Planning Code by: 1) adding Section 739.1 to establish the Outer Sunset Commercial Cluster 1 Neighborhood Commercial District that includes currently zoned NC-2 Noriega Street from 19th through 27th and 30th through 33rd Avenues; 2) adding Section 740.1 to establish the Outer Sunset Commercial Cluster 2 Neighborhood Commercial District that includes currently zoned NC-1 Taraval Street from 40th through 41st Avenues and from 45th through 47th Avenues, Noriega Street from 38th through 39th and 44th through 47th Avenues, Judah Street from 27th through 29th, 38th through 40th, and 44th through 47th Avenues, and Irving Street from 40th through 41st and 45th through 46th Avenues: 3) adding Section 741.1 to establish the Outer Sunset Linear Streets Neighborhood Commercial District that includes currently zoned NC-2 Taraval Street from 19th through 36th Avenues, Judah Street from 29th through 33rd Avenues, and Irving Street from 19th through 27th Avenues; 4) amending Section 724.124 (trade shops) to allow catering, remove horsepower limitations, and allow wholesaling, manufacturing and processing as an accessory use for up to two-thirds of the gross floor area; 5) amending Sheet ZN05 of the Zoning Map to include the new Neighborhood Commercial Districts; and 6) making environmental findings. Planning Code Section 302 findings, and findings of consistency with General Plan and the Priority Policies of Planning Code Section 101.1. ASSIGNED UNDER 30 DAY RULE to Land Use and Economic Development Committee.

120242 [Appropriating \$46,935,000 of 2012 Series A Refunding Revenue Bonds, and De-Appropriating \$2,431,363 for the Municipal Transportation Agency in FY2011-2012]

Ordinance appropriating \$46,935,000 of the 2012 Series A Parking Garage Refunding, and de-appropriating \$2,431,363 in existing debt service reserve funds, for the Municipal Transportation Agency in FY2011-2012 for parking meter and parking garage refunding, and placing these funds on Controller's Reserve pending the sale of the bonds. RECEIVED AND ASSIGNED to Budget and Finance Sub-Committee.

120243 [Appropriating \$28,300,000 of 2012 Series B Revenue Bonds for Transit Projects and Parking Garage Projects, for the Municipal Transportation Agency in FY2011-2012]

Ordinance appropriating \$28,300,000 of the 2012 Series B Revenue Bonds for Transit Projects and for Parking Garage Projects proceeds to the Municipal Transportation Agency in FY2011-2012 for improvements to transit access, reliability, communication, and capital improvements to parking garages, and placing these funds on Controller's Reserve pending the sale of the bonds. 120192 [Administrative Code - Board Approval of Grants Over \$100,000]
