120883 [Planning Code - Establishing a Program to Monitor Student Housing Conversions]

Sponsors: Kim; Wiener

Ordinance amending the Planning Code, by adding Section 102.36.1, to establish an annual monitoring requirement for student housing conversions and making findings, including environmental findings, and findings of consistency with the priority policies of Planning Code, Section 101.1, and the General Plan. SUBSTITUTED AND ASSIGNED to Land Use and Economic Development Committee.

121065 [Planning Code, Zoning Map - Polk Street Alcohol and Tobacco Paraphernalia Restrictions; Establishing Lower Polk Street Alcohol Restricted Use District] Sponsor: Chiu

Ordinance amending the Planning Code, Section 723, to extend the restriction on Tobacco Paraphernalia Establishments in the Polk Street Neighborhood Commercial District (NCD) for an additional three years and apply it to an area within one-quarter mile of the boundaries of the NCD; adding Section 788, to establish the Lower Polk Street Alcohol Restricted Use District for the properties located on Polk Street between California Street to the north, O'Farrell Street to the south, and Polk Street's side streets between California Street, Larkin Street, O'Farrell Street and Van Ness Avenue; amending the Zoning Map to designate the Lower Polk Street Alcohol Restricted Use District on Map Sheet ZN-02; and making environmental findings, Planning Code, Section 302, findings, and findings of consistency with the General Plan and the Priority Policies of Planning Code, Section 101.1. SUBSTITUTED AND ASSIGNED to Land Use and Economic Development Committee.

130275 [Appropriation - Surplus Revenues, Expenditures, and General Fund Reserve of \$3,749,644 Supporting Shortfalls - FY2012-2013]

Sponsor: Mayor

Ordinance appropriating \$3,749,644 in the Sheriff's Department, including \$3,458,970 from General Reserve and \$290,674 from State Disability Claim Reimbursement in the amount of \$1,197,779 for Worker's Compensation Expense, \$3,195,726 for overtime expenditures, and \$538,690 for reduction of revenues; including revenue de-appropriation of \$538,690 for reduction of State revenues and expenditure de-appropriation of \$1,182,551 for permanent salaries and materials and supplies in order to support the Sheriff's Department projected expenditures; as required per Ordinance No. 194-11, this Ordinance requires a two-thirds vote of all members of the Board of Supervisors for approval for \$3,195,726 of this request. ASSIGNED to Budget and Finance Committee.

130283 [Appropriation - Surplus Revenues, Expenditures, City Reserve for State Revenue Loss, and General Fund Reserve of \$38,689,454 Supporting Shortfalls - FY2012-2013]

Sponsor: Mayor

Ordinance appropriating \$38,689,454 in the Department of Public Health, including \$4,314,849 of General Fund Reserves, \$8,410,605 of the City Reserves for State Revenue Loss, and \$2,600,000 from Community Mental Health Services; surplus hospital revenues of \$6,504,000 in General Hospital, \$12,560,000 of Laguna Honda Hospital Revenues, and \$4,300,000 of Laguna Honda Hospital Reserve for Debt Service (Senate Bill 1128) revenues are recognized, as well as expenditure reductions of \$7,389,546 and additional expenditures of \$35,070,000 at San Francisco General Hospital, and \$11,009,000 at Laguna Honda Hospital. TRANSFERRED to Budget and Finance Committee.

130284 [Planning, Building Codes - Fee Waiver Program - Small Business Month, May 2013]

Ordinance recognizing Small Business Month in May 2013; amending the Planning Code, Sections 302, 355(a), and 355(e); and amending Building Code, Tables 1A-A, and 1A-E, to waive fees for the month of May for certain façade improvements; and making findings, including environmental findings and findings of consistency with the General Plan and priority policies of Planning Code, Section 101.1.
