130412 [Public Works Code - Installation of Communications Infrastructure in Excavation Projects]

Sponsors: Chiu; Wiener

Ordinance amending the Public Works Code to require the installation of City-owned communications infrastructure in excavation projects where the City has determined that it is both financially feasible and consistent with the City's long-term goals to develop the City's communications infrastructure. SUBSTITUTED AND ASSIGNED to Land Use and Economic Development Committee.

140804 [Planning Code - Arcades in the Haight Street Neighborhood Commercial District]

Sponsors: Breed; Wiener

Ordinance amending the Planning Code to permit arcades in the Haight Street Neighborhood Commercial District; affirming the Planning Department's determination under the California Environmental Quality Act; and making findings of consistency with the General Plan, and the eight priority policies of Planning Code, Section 101.1. SUBSTITUTED AND ASSIGNED to Land Use and Economic Development Committee.

140805 [Administrative, Environment Codes - Clean Construction Ordinance Updates] Sponsor: Cohen

Ordinance amending the Environment Code to require a Construction Emissions Minimization Plan and monitoring for certain public works projects within an Air Pollutant Exposure Zone and to require controls on emission-producing equipment used for public works projects outside of such zones; and amending the Administrative Code to incorporate these requirements in construction contracts where applicable; and making environmental findings. SUBSTITUTED AND ASSIGNED to Land Use and Economic Development Committee.

141023 [Development Agreement - 181 Fremont Street, LLC - 181 Fremont Street -Transbay Redevelopment Project Area]

Ordinance approving a Development Agreement between the City and County of San Francisco and 181 Fremont Street, LLC, for certain real property, known as 181 Fremont Street, located in the Transbay Redevelopment Project Area, consisting of two parcels located on the east side of Fremont Street, between Mission and Howard Streets; making findings of conformity with the General Plan, and the eight priority policies of Planning Code, Section 101.1(b); and waiving certain provisions of Administrative Code, Chapter 56, and Planning Code, Section 249.28. ASSIGNED to Land Use and Economic Development Committee.

141024 [Police Code - Fair Scheduling and Treatment of Formula Retail Employees] Sponsors: Chiu; Mar

Ordinance amending the Police Code to require Formula Retail Establishments to provide employees with two weeks' notice of work schedules, notice of changes to work schedules, and compensation for schedule changes made on less than seven days' notice and unused on-call shifts, and provide part-time employees with the same starting rate of hourly pay, access to time off, and eligibility for promotions as that provided to full-time employees.
