141093 [Zoning - Interim Moratorium Extension on Production, Distribution, and Repair Conversion in the Proposed Central South of Market Plan Area]

Sponsors: Kim; Avalos, Campos, Chiu and Mar

Urgency Ordinance approving an extension of the interim zoning moratorium to prohibit the conversion or replacement of Production, Distribution, and Repair uses in the proposed Central South of Market Plan Area bounded by Market Street on the north, Townsend Street on the south, 2nd Street on the east, and 6th Street on the west, for 22 months and 15 days, affirming the Planning Department's determination under the California Environmental Quality Act, and making findings of consistency with the eight priority policies of Planning Code, Section 101.1. ASSIGNED to Land Use and Economic Development Committee.
