Emergency ordinance to temporarily require private employers with 500 or more employees to provide public health emergency leave during the public health emergency related to COVID-19. (Pursuant to Charter, Section 2.107, this matter requires the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the Board of Supervisors (8 votes) for passage.)

Heard in Committee. Speakers: Anne Pearson (Office of the City Attorney); provided an overview and responded to questions raised throughout the discussion. Mr. Terrell; Shelly Tully; Anna Terano; Kong Fang; Emily Abraham (San Francisco Chamber of Commerce); Angela (South of Market Community Action Network); spoke in support of the matter. Speaker; spoke neither in support nor opposition on the matter.

Supervisor Ronen requested to be added as a co-sponsor.

Supervisor Mar moved that this Ordinance be AMENDED, AN AMENDMENT OF THE WHOLE BEARING SAME TITLE, on Page 6, Lines 6-7, to insert 'as each term is defined in 29 C.F.R. 826.30(c), as may be amended from time to time; Page, 6, Lines 8-9, to strike "Health care provider" has the meaning given to such term in section 101 of the Family and Medical Leave Act of 1993, 29 U.S.C 2611, as may be amended from time to time'; Page 6, Lines 12-16, to insert 'provided however that an Employer's obligation to provide Public Health Emergency Leave under Section 4(a) shall be reduced for every hour an Employer allowed an Employee to take paid leave or paid time off consistent with the requirements of Section 4(h), not including previously accrued hours, on or after February 25, 2020, for any of the reasons described in Sections 5(a); Page 7, Lines 22-25, to insert 'Futher, this incudes an Employee who is a member of a "vulnerable population" as defined in Order No. C19-05 who is unable to work due to recommendations in Order No. C19-05, C19-07b, or any order issued by Governor Newsom or Bay Area jurisdictions recommending or requiring additional restrictions for vulnerable or high-risk populations'; Page 9, Lines 16-17, to insert 'as well as of City, State, or Federal resources that Employees negatively impacted by the Public Health emergency may qualify to received; Page 9, Lines 22-24, to insert 'every employer shall provde the notice in English, Spanish, Chinese, and any language spoken by at least 5% of the Employees who are, or prior to the Public Health Emergency were, at the workplace or job site'; Page 10, Line 15, to insert 'reduce other Employee benefits,; and adding other clarifying and conforming changes.
