ADDENDUM

The following information is provided by speaker(s), pursuant to Administrative Code, Section 67.16. The content is neither generated by, nor subject to approval or verification of accuracy by, the Clerk of the Board or the Board of Supervisors.

Wynship Hillier submitted the following additional informatio during Public Committe on File No. 200951 as follows: "I oppose this legislation because it would harm the Behavioral Health Commission. The former Executive Director of BHC told me recently, "Over the years, I have talked with a number of Board/Commission chairs who have had a lot of problems working with their county Department of Health. . . ." DPH staffing of BHC would hinder BHC's investigation of massive violations of patient's Constitutional rights. San Francisco is the worst county in the state, by a 50% margin, for long-term involuntary mental health treatment, gavelling 2,500 patients into it each year. This could only be done by abrogating these patients' Constitutional rights through ex parte proceedings in totally-sealed cases, immunized from all challenge. How will BHC investigate DPH's role in this if BHC is staffed by DPH?"
