Ordinance amending the Administrative Code to prohibit the City from using resources to create, implement, provide investigation or information for, enforce, or otherwise assist or support any government program requiring the registration of individuals on the basis of religion, or creating a database of individuals on the basis of religion.

Vice Chair Sheehy, seconded by Member Fewer, moved that this Ordinance be AMENDED, AMENDMENT OF THE WHOLE BEARING NEW TITLE, on Page 1, Line 1, by striking 'Religion' and adding 'Identity-Based'; by adding references to national origin and ethnicity where religion is referenced; requiring an annual report out to the Board of Supervisors; clarifying that the prohibition on sharing personal information for purposes of creating a registry applies to City databases maintained by vendors contracting with the City; adding language in relation to compliance with the United States Code, Section 1373 of Title 8; and adding other clarifying verbiage. The motion carried by the following vote:

# 161352 [Health Code - Sale of Domestic Dogs and Cats]

#### Sponsor: Tang
