The Police Department submitted a response recommending approval with the following conditions: 1) sales, service and consumption of alcoholic beverages shall be permitted between the hours of 10:00 a.m. until 12:00 a.m. Sunday through Wednesday and 10:00 a.m. until 2:00 a.m. Thursday through Saturday; 2) the sale of alcoholic beverages for off-sale consumption is strictly prohibited; 3) no distilled spirits shall be sold by the bottle; 4) petitioner shall actively monitor the area under their control in an effort to prevent the loitering of persons on any property adjacent to the premises as depicted on the most-recently-certified ABC-257; and 5) between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 2:00 a.m. or at any time the premises are providing live entertainment, the petitioner(s) shall provide three (3) uniformed security guard(s) in the parking lot and/or premises and shall maintain order therein and prevent and activity which would interfere with quiet enjoyment of their property by nearby residents or the surrounding community; the licensed uniform security guard must be licensed by the State of California Department of Consumer Affairs.
