Chair Mar moved that this Ordinance be AMENDED, AN AMENDMENT OF THE WHOLE BEARING NEW TITLE, on Page 1, Lines 4-5, by specifying an adult residential facility with no fewer than 41 beds; on Page 2, Lines 18-19, by correcting numerical errors in the number of beds and the Community Care Licensing Division's approval extension; on Page 3, Lines 5-7, by inserting '(a) As of the effective date of this Article 45, and until March 31, 2020, DPH shall operate 28 of the beds at the ARF located at 887 Potrero Avenue as emergency shelter beds for people experiencing homelessness.'; on Page 3, Lines 8-10, by striking 'As of the effective date of this Article 45', inserting 'By no later than April 1, 2020', and specifying that the Department of Public Health shall maintain and operate at full capacity a licensed adult residential facility with no fewer than 41 beds; on Page 3, Lines 17-20, by inserting '(2) Identify clinically appropriate alternative placements for five ARF residents, and work with those residents to facilitate their voluntary relocation. Patients who are offered clinically appropriate alternative placements shall be given the opportunity to discuss their options with the ombudsman program before being transferred'; on Page 4, Lines 3-8, by inserting '(e) DPH shall provide trauma-informed care training to all DPH staff who work at DPH's Behavioral Health Center located at 887 Potrero Ave. This training shall be provided by subject matter experts who do not work at the Behavioral Health Center. (f) DPH shall create a forum in which management and staff of the ARF located at 887 Potrero Avenue can discuss issues relating to resident care and workplace conditions, and shall conduct an analysis and review of the Behavioral Health Center.'; on Page 4, Lines 11-14, by striking 'Within three months of the effective date of this Article 45' and specifying that no later than March 31, 2020, DPH shall submit to the Board of Supervisors a report summarizing the actions it has taken in compliance with Article 45, and its analysis and review of the Behavioral Health Center; on Page 4, Lines 14-19, by striking 'report that describes: (a) The number of ARF beds that have been filled and the number that remain vacant; (b) The number of personnel hired to work at the ARF; and (c) The steps that DPH has taken to ensure compliance with the Corrective Action Plan.'; and making other conforming and clerical amendments. Vicki Hennessy in her official capacity as the San Francisco Sheriff, et al.; the lawsuit involves claims that the Sheriff's use of the San Francisco Superior Court's bail schedule as a basis for pre-arraignment detention or release of arrestees violates the United States Constitution.
