**Member Peskin moved that this Resolution be AMENDED, AN AMENDMENT OF THE WHOLE BEARING NEW TITLE, by striking 'Sites: The Hazardous Waste' on Page 1, Lines 1-2; on Page 2, Line 5, by striking 'whether open or closed'; on Page 2, Lines 17-18, by striking 'contaminated Cortese List'; on Page 3, Lines 1-2, by striking 'CEQA requires that' and replacing it with 'A preliminary mitigated negative declaration under CEQA requires' and adding 'that' after 'site'; on Page 4, Line 3, and Lines 5-7, by striking 'claimed' and replacing it with 'indicated', striking subsequently deeming its prior practice "regrettable"; and replacing it with 'stating that the confusion that resulted from the conflicting guidance from the state is "regrettable"; on Page 5, Lines 1-2, by striking 'Hazardous Waste Site and Cleanup' and replacing it with 'Contaminated Site Cleanup and Safety'; on Page 5, Lines 7-9, by striking 'the "consolidated List created and distributed by the Secretary of Environmental Protection;"' and replacing it with "a list compiled pursuant to the Contaminated Site Cleanup and Safety Act;"'; and on Page 5, Lines 16-17, by striking 'Senate's Environmental Quality Committee' and replacing it with 'the Senate's Appropriations Committee'.
