In some cases, commercial landlords and their tenants may have executed written agreements in response to the COVID-19 pandemic in order to reduce, waive, or extend the tenant's deadline to pay rent that might otherwise have been due. It is the policy of the Board of Supervisors to encourage such negotiated agreements. Accordingly, the presumption in subsection (b) shall not apply to those rent payments that the landlord and tenant addressed in such a negotiated agreement, assuming the agreement is otherwise legal and valid.'; and adding other clarifying and conforming changes.
