### 201337 [Liquor License Transfer - 355 Bayshore Boulevard - Grocery Outlet]

Hearing to consider that the transfer of a Type-21 off-sale general beer, wine, and distilled spirits liquor license to Grocery Outlet Inc, doing business as Grocery Outlet, located at 355 Bayshore Boulevard (District 10), will serve the public convenience or necessity of the City and County of San Francisco. 01/20/21; RESPONSE RECEIVED. The Police Department submitted a response recommending approval with the following conditions:

- 1) Sales, service and consumption of alcoholic beverages shall be permitted only between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 11:00 p.m. each day of the week;
- 2) The sale of distilled spirits in sizes smaller than 200 milliliters is strictly prohibited;
- 3) Beer, malt beverages, and wine coolers in containers of 16 ounces or less cannot be sold by single containers from a refrigerator or cooler but must be sold in manufacturer pre-packaged multi-unit quantities; This restriction applies to any beer that is not sold or marketed by the manufacturer in a multi-unit package quantity; and
- 4) Petitioner(s) shall actively monitor the area under their control in an effort to prevent the loitering of persons on any property adjacent to the licensed premises as depicted on ABC-253.

*Heard in Committee. Speakers: Justin A. Zucker (Reuben Junius and Rose, LLP); Darius Tehranchi (Grocery Outlet, Inc.); Officer Joel Salmonson (Police Department); presented information and answered questions raised throughout the discussion.*

**200830 [Police Code - Right to Reemployment Following Layoff Due to COVID-19 Pandemic]****Sponsor: Mar**

Ordinance amending the Police Code to create a right to reemployment for certain employees laid-off due to the COVID-19 pandemic if their employer seeks to fill the same position previously held by the laid-off employee, or a substantially similar position, and to reasonably accommodate employees who cannot work because of a family care hardship.

09/21/20; RESPONSE RECEIVED. On September 14, 2020, the Small Business Commission met and voted 6 to 0 to oppose the proposed ordinance.
