The Police Department's ABC Liaison Unit recommended approval, with the following conditions: 1) Petitioner(s) shall actively monitor the area under their control in an effort to prevent the loitering of persons on any property adjacent to the licensed premises as depicted on ABC-253; 2) No noise shall be audible at any nearby residence; 3) When the said outdoor patio area of the premises is being utilized for the sales, service and consumption of alcoholic beverages, a premise employee shall be in attendance and maintain continuous supervision at all times of said area to ensure orderly conduct of patrons; and 4) Sales, service and consumption of alcoholic beverages on the patio area shall only be permitted between the hours of 12:00 p.m. and 10:00 p.m. daily.

Heard in Committee. Speakers: Officer Joel Salmonson (Police Department); presented information on the hearing matter and answered questions raised throughout the discussion.

A determination that the public convenience or necessity would be served was recommended by the committee.
