Member Chan moved that this Resolution be AMENDED, AN AMENDMENT OF THE WHOLE BEARING NEW TITLE, on Page 1, Line 1, to read 'Urging Program Metrics For the Taxi Upfront Fare Pilot'; on Page 1, Lines 3-6, to read 'Resolution urging the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency (SFMTA) Board of Directors to track additional data and develop additional program metrics for its Taxi Upfront Fare Pilot program and continue to submit a quarterly report to the Board of Supervisors to ensure improved outcomes and benefits for taxi drivers.'; on Page 1, Line 10, by adding '(pilot)'; on Page 1, Line 12, by replacing 'SFMTA Board' with "MTAB'; on Page 1, Lines 15-16, by adding 'WHEREAS, On September 19, 2023, the MTAB extended the Taxi Upfront Fare Pilot program term through to June 30, 2025; and'; on Page 2, Lines 11-12, to read '8A.115 of the San Francisco Charter. and over 90 percent of the taxi fleet operates low emission vehicles'; on Page 2, Line 13, by striking 'and further give TNCs permission to deviate from publicly regulated and transparent meter fares for taxis booked through third-party applications.' and adding 'WHEREAS, The third-party dispatch system allows TNC customers to access'; on Page 2, Line 15, by replacing 'SFMTA's' with 'The MTAB's'; on Page 2, Lines 18 - 19, by striking 'WHEREAS, SFMTA's Taxi Upfront Fare Pilot Program relinquishes SFMTA's charter mandated authority to regulate taxi meter fares for all cab rides booked through third-party dispatch systems to TNCs, in particular to Uber and as a result could create a monopoly: and WHEREAS. This pilot program abdicates SFMTA's exclusive authority over taxi-related fares for rides originating with third party entities; and' and adding 'WHEREAS, Continuing a failed pilot program could lead to a monopoly in the taxi industry; and'; on Page 2, Lines 21-23, by striking 'with Uber's average rate being approximately 80 to 85 percent of taxi meter rates'; on Page 3, Line 2, by striking 'not publicly available information' and adding 'reported to the SFMTA as a weighted monthly average, and'; on Page 3, Line 6, by replacing 'apps' with 'applications'; on Page 3, Lines 7-8, by striking ' There is no provision in the third-party program for the protection of riders who rely on paratransit taxi service, making it more difficult for individuals with disabilities to utilize this service; and' and adding 'The SFMTA is tracking paratransit taxi service to understand the impact, if any, of third-party pilot trips on paratransit taxi customers; and'; on Page 3, Lines 9-12 to read WHEREAS, The San Francisco Taxi Workers Alliance (TWA), with over 500 registered taxi driving members, was not consulted in development of the third-party dispatch aspect of the pilot program and, in conjunction with other stakeholder organizations, urged the MTAB to vote in opposition to the Taxi Upfront Fare program; and'; on Page 3, Lines 21-24, to read 'RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco urges the MTAB to develop additional metrics to assess the impacts, if any, of allowing third-party dispatch trips in order to determine whether third-party trips are supplementing or replacing street hail, dispatch, or e-taxi trips; and be it'; on Page 4, Lines 1-10, by adding 'FURTHER RESOLVED, That the MTAB is strongly urged to continue collecting data quarterly on the total amount charged to third-party passengers, including fares and any other related charges, and the total amount paid to taxi drivers for third-party trips and continue to submit quarterly reports to the Board of Supervisors; and be it FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco urges the MTAB to support this pilot extension until June 30, 2025, on the condition that the quarterly report shows at least a 10 percent or greater increase in revenue for taxi drivers who participate in the third-party trips, and more transparency in passenger fares versus driver incomes and the SFMTA staff continues regular engagement with stakeholders for feedback;' and making clarifying and conforming changes.
