12/22/22; REFERRED TO DEPARTMENT. Referred to the Planning Department and Police Department for recommendation.

12/22/22; RESPONSE RECEIVED. The Planning Department recommends to approve the Type-48 proposed at 3336 24th Street. This recommendation is for a change of ownership only. The legal commercial use for the said address is a bar use as defined in Planning Code, Section 102.

12/23/22; RECEIVED AND ASSIGNED to Public Safety and Neighborhood Services Committee.

02/15/23; RESPONSE RECEIVED. The Police Department submitted a response recommending approval with the following condition:

1) Petitioner(s) shall actively monitor the area under their control in an effort to prevent the loitering of persons on any property adjacent to the licensed premises as depicted on the ABC-253; and 2) Entertainment provided shall not be audible at any nearby residence or consideration point.

Heard in Committee. Speakers: Officer Joel Salmonson (Police Department); Francisco Javier Villalobos; presented information and answered questions raised throughout the discussion.

A determination that the public convenience or necessity would be served was recommended by the committee.

Chair Stefani moved that this Hearing be PREPARED IN COMMITTEE AS A RESOLUTION, making a determination that the transfer of a Type-48 on-sale general public premises liquor license to the applicant will serve the public convenience or necessity. The motion carried by the following vote:
