Hearing to consider that the issuance of a Type-20 off-sale beer and wine liquor license to Dapper Nob Hill LLC, to do business as Dapper located at 1198 Pacific Avenue (District 3) will serve the public convenience or necessity of the City and County of San Francisco. A General Grocery Store, as defined by Planning Code, Section 102 is a Retail Sales and Service Use, which is principally permitted in the Pacific Avenue Neighborhood Commercial District per Planning Code, Section 726. Area devoted to alcohol sales may not exceed 15% of the Occupied Floor Area of the establishment and shall operate with the specified conditions in Section 202.2(a)(1).

Hearing to consider that the person-to-person, premises-to-premises transfer of a Type-21 off-sale general beer, wine, and distilled spirits liquor license to Save Mart Supermarkets LLC, doing business as Lucky Bayview, located at 3801-3 Street (District 10), will serve the public convenience or necessity of the City and County of San Francisco. (Public Safety and Neighborhood Services Committee)

The applicant submitted a request for a determination on the public convenience or necessity of the issuance of a Type-21 off-sale general beer, wine, and distilled spirits liquor license to Save Mart Supermarkets LLC, to do business as Lucky Bayview, located at 3801-3rd Street.

Planning recommends approval of the type 20 proposed at 3801 03rd Street - Approved as an accessory use to the roughly 10,000 square foot grocery store dba "Lucky's" with the following conditions: apply to General Grocery and Specialty Grocery stores that exceed 5,000 square feet in size and shall not: (1) sell any malt beverage with an alcohol content greater than 5.7 percent by volume; any wine with an alcohol content of greater than 15 percent by volume, except for "dinner wines" that have been aged two years or more and maintained in a corked bottle; or any distilled spirits in container sizes smaller than 600 milliliters; (2) devote more than 15 percent of the gross square footage of the establishment to the display and sale of alcoholic beverages; and (3) sell single servings of beer in container sizes 24 ounces or smaller.

Ordinance amending the Police Code to allow holders of temporary cannabis business permits to transfer an aggregate ownership interest of 50% or more in the business to persons that were not owners at the time the temporary permit was issued so long as five years or more have passed since the Office of Cannabis Director first acknowledged receipt of the business's application for a temporary cannabis business permit, regardless of whether the business has received a permanent cannabis business permit.
