230729 [Liquor License Transfer - 3239 Balboa Street - Slake]

Hearing to consider that the person-to-person, premises-to-premises transfer of a Type-21 off-sale general beer, wine, and distilled spirits liquor license to Coolwater SF LLC, doing business as Slake San Francisco Bottle and Sundry, located at 3239 Balboa Street (District 1), will serve the public convenience or necessity of the City and County of San Francisco. (Clerk of the Board)

The applicant submitted a request for a determination on the public convenience or necessity of the transfer of a Type-21 off-sale general beer, wine, and distilled spirits liquor license to Coolwater SF LLC, doing business as Slake San Francisco Bottle and Sundry, located at 3239 Balboa Street

07/07/23; RECEIVED AND ASSIGNED to Public Safety and Neighborhood Services Committee.

07/07/23; REFERRED TO DEPARTMENT. Referred to the Planning Department and Police Department for recommendation.

07/27/23; RESPONSE RECEIVED. The Planning Department recommends approval of an ABC Type-21 (Off-Sale General) license, permitted with the establishment of a new liquor store use (DBA Slake San Francisco Bottle and Sundry) on the ground floor in the Outer Balboa Street Neighborhood Commercial District Zoning District per Planning Code, Sections 102, 202.2(a)(6), and 736. Per Planning Code, Section 202.2 (a)(6), the establishment is subject to the following conditions:

• Employees of the establishment shall walk a 100-foot radius from the premises sometime between 30 minutes after closing time and 8:00 a.m. the following morning, and shall pick up and dispose of any discarded beverage containers and other trash left by patrons;

The business operator shall provide outside lighting sufficient to illuminate street and sidewalk areas and adjacent parking as appropriate to maintain security, without disturbing area residents; and
The store frontage shall comply with the visibility requirements of Section 145.I(c)(6) and the signage requirements of Article 6 of this Code. In addition, all advertising and signage shall be placed and maintained in a manner that ensures that law enforcement personnel have a clear and unobstructed view of the interior of the premises, including the area in which the cash registers are maintained, from the exterior public sidewalk or entrance to the premises.

08/29/23; RESPONSE RECEIVED. The Police Department submitted a response recommending approval with no additional conditions.

Hearing to consider that the issuance of a Type-64 special on-sale general theater liquor license to ODC, doing business as the ODC Theater, located at 3153-17 Street (District 9), will serve the public convenience or necessity of the City and County of San Francisco. (Clerk of the Board)

Theater companies holding this license may sell and serve alcoholic beverages to ticketholders only during, and two hours prior to and one hour after, a bona fide theater performance of the company.
