



RESCISSION OF HEALTH OFFICER DIRECTIVES

**RESCISSION OF DIRECTIVE NOS. 2020-14 AND 2020-33 OF THE HEALTH
OFFICER OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF SAN FRANCISCO**

(PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY DIRECTIVE)

DATE OF RESCISSION: June 30, 2022

Effective at 12:01 a.m. on July 1, 2022, the directives of the Health Officer of the City and County of San Francisco listed below are rescinded in full. This rescission is based on the current state of the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (“COVID-19”) pandemic, including the wide availability of vaccination for most children. San Francisco’s vaccination rate compares favorably globally with countries with the highest vaccination rates. Based on this data, other COVID-19 indicators, and the evolving scientific understanding of the risks posed by COVID-19, including the impact of vaccination, the Health Officer has determined it is now appropriate to remove the remaining local health guidance relating to COVID-19 for schools and youth programs in favor state and federal guidance. Health Officer Order No. C19-07y, including as it is revised in the future, remains in effect and provides ongoing guidance for key areas that remain of concern. And everyone in the City remains subject to State and Federal rules and other Health Officer orders and directives until they are rescinded.
