The African American Arts and Cultural District Community Advisory Committee consist of seven voting members, nominated by the Supervisor for District 10 and appointed by the Board of Supervisors. Members of the Advisory Committee shall reside within the boundaries of the African American Arts and Cultural District and have the following additional qualifications.

- *Seat 1 shall be held by an owner of a business located in the District.*
- *Seat 2 shall be held by an employee of a nonprofit organization located in the District.*
- *Seat 3 shall be held by a person with knowledge or expertise regarding the history or culture of the District.*

- *Seat 4 shall be held by a youth between ages of 14 to 24, inclusive, at the time of appointment.*
- *Seats 5, 6, and 7 shall have no additional qualifications.*

The Committee shall advise the Board of Supervisors, the Mayor, and the Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development regarding strategies to support and preserve the unique culture and heritage of the African American Arts and Cultural District and shall provide input to all City agencies in the preparation of reports required under Section 107A.2 of this Code. The Committee shall also advise the Board of Supervisors, the Mayor, and the Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development regarding any potential need to re-examine the boundaries of the District.

The Committee members may remain on the Committee until the termination of the Committee, under Administrative Code, Section 5.30-6. Unless the Board of Supervisors by ordinance extends the term of the Committee, and notwithstanding Board of Supervisors Rule 2.21, the Committee shall terminate on June 30, 2028.

The Committee shall hold its inaugural meeting not more than 60 days after the Board has appointed at least four members. There shall be at least 10 days' public notice of the inaugural meeting. Following the inaugural meeting, the Committee shall hold a regular meeting not less than four times a year until the sunset date set forth in Administrative Code, Section 5.30-6.

Report: The Historic Preservation Commission, Office of Economic and Workforce Development, Arts Commission, Department of Public Works, Planning Department, and the Human Rights Commission shall seek input from the Committee and compile relevant reports and recommendations that shall be submitted to the Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development by no later than September 1, 2025.

The Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development shall prepare and submit to the Board of Supervisors and the Mayor a Culture, History, Housing, and Economic Sustainability Strategy Report for the District no later than February 1, 2026.

DESCRIPTION:

The Assessment Appeals Board No. 1 consists of eight (8) members (five (5) regular members, and three (3) alternate members) all appointed by the Board of Supervisors. No person may concurrently hold a seat on more than one of the three Assessment Appeals Boards.

The Board members' term of office is three years, beginning on the first Monday in September. In the event of a vacancy, the newly appointed member shall serve for the remainder of the unexpired term.

The Board shall have the following qualifications as stated in the eligibility criteria set forth in California Revenue and Taxation Code, Section 1624.05, as follows: Must have a minimum of five years professional experience in the State of California as one of the following: Certified Public Accountant or Public Accountant; licensed Real Estate Broker; Attorney; or a Property Appraiser accredited by a nationally recognized professional organization, certified by the Office of Real Estate Appraisers, or certified by the State Board of Equalization. Hearing Officers: The regular and alternate members of the Board shall also serve as hearing officers. The Clerk shall designate members to act as hearing officers for particular applications using a rotating system designed to assure that all members with the same priority level have an equal opportunity over time to participate as hearing officers. The Clerk shall designate hearing officers in the following priority order: (1) the regular member of Assessment Appeals Board No. 3; (2) the alternate members of Assessment Appeals Board No. 3; (3) the alternate members of Assessment Appeals Board No. 2; (4) the alternate members of Assessment Appeals Board No. 1; (5) the regular members of Assessment Appeals Board No. 2; and (6) the regular members of Assessment Appeals Board No. 1. In their capacity as assessment hearing officers, the officers shall serve at the pleasure of and by contract with the Board of Supervisors.

DUTIES:

It shall be the duty of each Assessment Appeals Board to equalize the valuation of the taxable property within the City and County for the purposes of taxation in the manner and subject to the limitations contained in Article XIII of the California State Constitution. Assessment Appeals Board No. 1 shall have jurisdiction to hear applications for reduction affecting any property on the secured or unsecured rolls without limitation. In addition, the Clerk shall exclusively assign to Assessment Appeals Board No. 1 any application for reduction that involves real property located all or in part within Assessor's Block Nos. 1-876 or 3701-3899, not including residential property consisting of four units or less; a possessory interest; or property on the secured or unsecured roll assessed at \$50,000,000 or more.

COMPENSATION:

\$175 for each one-half day of service

Assessment Appeals Board No. 2 shall have jurisdiction to hear applications for reductions only for property assessed at less than \$50,000,000, excluding applications involving possessory interests or real property located all or in part within Assessor's Block Nos. 1-876 or 3701-3899, and reduction for residential real property consisting of four units or less within Assessor's Block Nos. 1-876 or 3701-3899.

COMPENSATION:

\$175 for each one-half day of service.

The City and County of San Francisco is entitled to appoint three members to the Bay Area Air Quality Management District, Board of Directors, two of whom are appointed by the Board of Supervisors, and may either be a member of the Board of Supervisors or a person on the list submitted to the Board of Supervisors by the City Selection Committee, and a third member is appointed by the Mayor. The members are appointed on the basis of the population of that portion of the county, as determined by the latest estimate of the Revenue and Taxation Code, included within the district. A county with a population of 1,000,000 or less, but more than 750,000 shall appoint three members of the Bay District Board.

Term of Office: Each member appointed by the Board of Supervisors shall hold office for a term of four years and until the appointment and qualifications of his successor. No Supervisor shall be a member for more than three months after ceasing to hold the office of supervisor, when his or her membership shall be considered vacant.

The Mayor or their designee shall hold office for a term of two years.

The Board meets on the first and third Wednesday of each month at 9:30 am at 375 Beale Street in San Francisco. The composition of the members of the Commission is as follows: (a) One (1) member appointed by the Division Engineer, United States Army Engineers, South Pacific Division, from his or her staff; (b) One (1) member appointed by the Administrator of the United States Environmental Protection Agency, from his or her staff; (c) One (1) member appointed by the California Secretary of Business and Transportation from his or her staff; (d) One (1) member appointed by the California Director of Finance, from his or her staff; (e) One (1) member appointed by the California Secretary of Resources, from his or her staff; (f) One (1) member appointed by the California State Lands Commission, who shall be a member of that commission or from its staff; (g) One (1) member appointed by the San Francisco Bay Regional Water Quality Control Board, who shall be a member of that board (h) Nine county representatives consisting of one member of the Board of Supervisors representative of each of the nine San Francisco Bay Area counties, appointed by the Board of Supervisors in each county. Each county representative shall be a supervisor representing a supervisorial district which includes within its boundaries lands lying

with San Francisco Bay; (i) Four (4) city representatives appointed by the Association of Bay Area Governments from among the residents of the bayside cities in each of the following areas: (1) North Bay--Marin, Sonoma, Napa and Solano Counties; (2) East Bay-Contra Costa County (west of Pittsburg) and Alameda County north of the southern boundary of Hayward; (3) South Bay--Alameda County south of the southern boundary of Hayward, Santa Clara County, and San Mateo County south of the northern boundary of Redwood City; (4) West Bay--San Mateo County north of the northern boundary of Redwood City, and the City and County of San Francisco. Each city representative shall be an elected city official; (j) Seven (7) representatives of the public, who shall be residents of the San Francisco Bay Area. Five of the representatives shall be appointed by the Governor and their appointments shall be subject to confirmation by the Senate. One of the representatives shall be appointed by the Committee on Rules of the Senate, and one by the Speaker of the Assembly.

The commission shall provide a politically-responsible, democratic process by which the San Francisco Bay and its shoreline can be analyzed, planned, and regulated as a unit. The Commission shall make a continuing review of all the matters referred to in Section 66603 and Section 66651. Powers and duties of the Commission are stated in Section 66600 et seq.

Term of Office: Indefinite (not specified).

Reports: The Commission has prepared a comprehensive and enforceable plan for the conservation of the water of the bay and the development of its shoreline entitled the San Francisco Bay Plan.

The Bayview Hunters Point Citizens Advisory Committee (CAC) was established to provide policy advice to the Board of Supervisors, City boards, commissions and departments, including the Planning Commission and Planning Department, on planning and land use matters in Zone 2. The CAC provides advice on the appropriateness of projects, and land use and zoning designations for projects in Zone 2 or Survey Area C, and provide community guidance on the extent to which a development project furthers General Plan policies in Zone 2.

The CAC shall consist of 12 members:

- Four (4) members appointed by the District 10 Supervisor: three (3) voting members, and one (1) non-voting member.
- Four (4) members appointed by the Mayor: three (3) voting members, and one (1) non-voting member.
- Four (4) members appointed by the City Administrator: three (3) voting members, and one (1) non-voting member.

A member must be at least one of the following:

- 1) a resident of the Bayview Hunters Point Redevelopment Project Area (Project Area);
- 2) a person who owns a business with a fixed office in the City or real property in the City;
- 3) a representative of a neighborhood group in the Project Area; or
- 4) a resident of San Francisco who has experience working on architecture, planning or land use issues in San Francisco.

In addition, non-voting members must have professional expertise or training in disciplines such as architecture, land use, or urban planning that would be helpful to the CAC in the performance of its duties.

EXCLUSIONS AND RESTRICTIONS

An employee of the City may not be appointed as a voting member of the CAC, but may be appointed as a non-voting member. Each appointing authority shall notify the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in writing of each of its appointments to the committee, including which appointees shall be voting members. Members of the CAC shall serve at the pleasure of their appointing authority without compensation or benefits.

During his/her tenure, a member of the CAC may not receive income from, have any financial investments in, or be a party to, any contracts with any person or entity who is seeking project approvals or who receives a project approval from the City during the member's tenure regarding a property within Zone 2 or Survey Area C. "Project approvals" shall include conditional use authorizations, variances, certificates of appropriateness, and building permits.

During his/her tenure, a member of the CAC may not enter into, submit a bid for, negotiate for, or otherwise attempt to enter into, any contract with the City or obtain a subcontract of any tier to a contract with the City for services, real estate interest or other benefits in Zone 2 or Survey Area C. Any member of the CAC who violates this shall be deemed to have thereby resigned his or her position on the CAC.

Each member shall serve a term of two years. The term of the twelve (12) members first appointed to the committee shall commence on August 24, 2013 (the effective date of Ordinance No. 157-13).

In addition to the 11 voting members, the following City departments will each provide a non-voting representative to attend Advisory Committee meetings: 1) Police Department, 2) Public Works, 3) Municipal Transportation Agency, and 4) the Planning Department. The Board of Supervisors also requests that the 1) San Francisco Unified School District and the 2) Golden Gate National Recreation Area each be asked to send a non-voting representative to the Advisory Committee.

This Advisory Committee will be composed of concerned and informed residents and will provide the best single source of expertise and perspective for transportation planners. The term of each member of the Advisory Committee shall be two years or for the tenure of the Supervisor who nominated the member, whichever is shorter in duration.

The Advisory Committee shall have the power and duty to: a) set up subcommittees as necessary; b) develop a plan for bicycle-related improvements, including but not limited to bicycle routes, secure parking, and transit interface, and make recommendations to the Municipal Transportation Agency, the San Francisco County Transportation Authority, and the Board of Supervisors on related funding from local, State and Federal agencies, including, but not limited to Transportation Development Act funds and San Francisco County Transportation Authority funds; c) review the policies and programs related to bicycling in the Transportation Element of the Master Plan of the City and County of San Francisco, and make recommendations on the goals and their implementation to the Planning Commission of the City and County of San Francisco; and d) develop a plan for outreach to, and education of, the public to promote the safe sharing of public roadways, and submit the plan to the Municipal Transportation Agency and the San Francisco County Transportation Authority.

The Cannabis Oversight Committee (“Committee”) was established to convene representatives of Cannabis Business operators, workers, patients, and other key stakeholders in the Cannabis industry to oversee the Office of Cannabis’ implementation of Police Code, Article 16, by evaluating data on the industry’s growth; and provide guidance and recommendations to the Board of Supervisors on amendments to local laws and regulations, including those governing the Equity Program, to facilitate socially responsible growth of this new industry by creating living wage jobs and economic opportunities.

The Committee consists of a total of sixteen (16) members.

There are seven (7) non-voting members (seats 1 through 7), as follows:

- Seat 1 shall be held by the Director of the Department of Public Health or the Director’s designee.

The Office of Cannabis shall prepare and submit a report to the Committee no later than January 1, 2020, as set forth in Administrative Code, Section 2A.420, evaluating the growth of the City’s Cannabis industry.

Reports: The Committee shall gather and evaluate data, report, and make recommendations to the Board of Supervisors and Mayor on the effectiveness of City laws and regulations, and the overall health and stability of the Cannabis industry in San Francisco.

The Council will provide links between government and the community, and will work to maximize the amount and impact of local state, federal and private resources and funding for child care in San Francisco. Powers and Duties are outlined in Administrative Code, Section 5.200.

All terms shall be for three years. Members may serve for up to two consecutive terms, and may be re-appointed after one year off the Council. No terms served prior to March 8, 2010, shall be counted towards the term limit for Council members. A member appointed to serve a term of two years or less, including the initial term provided in the preceding paragraph, shall not be deemed to have served a full term for purposes of this term limit.

- A) close Juvenile Hall by no later than December 31, 2021;
- B) strengthen and expand community-based alternatives to detention;
- C) provide a rehabilitative, non-institutional place or places of detention, in a location approved by the Court, which is available for all wards of the Court and persons alleged to come within the jurisdiction of the Court;

- Seat 7 shall be held by an expert in youth mental illness, with experience serving the juvenile justice population, and expertise in best practices for serving youth with mental illness.
- Seat 8 shall be held by an expert in juvenile justice reform with experience in data analysis and the development of alternatives to detention.
- Seat 9 shall be held by a member of the labor community.
- Seats 10 and 11 shall be held by non-management employees working in Juvenile Hall.
- Seat 12 shall be held by the Chief Juvenile Probation Officer or the Chief Juvenile Probation Officer's designee.
- Seat 13 shall be held by the Public Defender or the Public Defender's designee.

The final plan shall be submitted to the Board of Supervisors no later than June 1, 2021, with a proposed resolution accepting the plan.

The Alignment Committee, by March 15, 2025, and every two years thereafter, shall submit to the WISF for review and comment updates to the Citywide Workforce Development Plan that include (A) a summary of the City's implementation of the plan, including data detailing departmental performance metrics solicited through the annual Citywide Workforce Services Inventory due in December of each year, (B) a summary of changes to federal and state funding, (C) a summary of current fiscal year programs and expenditures for Workforce Development Services, (D) recommended funding levels for new and existing collaborative programs and initiatives in furtherance of workforce system alignment for the next fiscal year, (E) a statement of priorities to guide the allocation of unanticipated funding that becomes available for Citywide Workforce Development Services during the annual budget process or during the fiscal year, and (F) progress towards benchmarks identified in the Five-Year Plan.

The Committee on Information Technology (“COIT”) was established to review and approve the recommendations of the Chief Information Officer (“CIO”) for (1) the five-year Information & Communication Technology (“ICT”) Plan, (2) ICT plans, budgets, projects and staffing plans for City Departments, and (3) ICT standards, policies and procedures to enable successful development, operation, maintenance and support of the City’s ICT. COIT shall also ensure the most cost-effective and useful retrieval and exchange of information both within and among City Departments and from the City to the people of San Francisco.

COIT shall be composed of seven permanent voting members, or their designees, as follows:

- Mayor
- President of the Board of Supervisors
- Controller
- City Administrator
- Chief Information Officer
- Clerk of the Board of Supervisors
- Executive Director of the Human Resources Department

Five additional voting members shall be Department Heads recommended by the Chair and approved by the five permanent members for two-year terms, one representing each of the major services areas:

- Public protection
- Human welfare and neighborhood development
- Community health
- Culture and recreation
- General administration and finance

Three additional voting members shall be recommended by the Chair and approved by the five permanent members for two-year terms, representing the major service area of public works, transportation, and commerce.

There are also two additional non-voting members selected by the voting members and cannot be employees of the City and County of San Francisco and shall have expertise in fields of ICT innovation and advances, emerging ICT applications, and public policy issues related to ICT.

The Department of Technology shall provide support to COIT.

Reports: Performance and financial reports on the Department of Technology and all other City Departments' ICT planning and purchases in the ICT Capital and Operating Plan and the annual reviews of the plan.

The Early Childhood Community Oversight and Advisory Committee (ECCOAC) was established to make recommendations to the Department of Early Childhood (the “Department”), established by Chapter 2A, Article XXIII of the Administrative Code, regarding the Department’s mission of providing early care and education for children ages zero to five in San Francisco and other City departments involved in early care and education initiatives. The ECCOAC shall also advise the Department on developing the Department Strategic Plan for expanding high-quality early care and education in San Francisco, as described in Section 2A.310 of the Administrative Code, and offer expertise in the areas of policy, planning, collaboration, and strategic partnerships. In collaboration with the Children and Families Commission (the “First Five Commission”), the ECCOAC shall provide input and recommendations to the Department regarding overall strategies, policies, and procedures for the Department. The ECCOAC shall provide analysis, guide design engagement processes, and make recommendations to the Department, the Mayor, and the Board of Supervisors regarding use of funds for the Early Care and Education for All Initiative, described in Section 20.17-1 of Article XVII of Chapter 20 of the Administrative Code, and the Babies and Families First Fund, described in Section 10.100-36 of Article XIII of Chapter 10 of the Administrative Code.

The ECCOAC shall consist of nine members: The Mayor shall appoint to seats 1-5 (subject to rejection by two-thirds vote of the Board of Supervisors within 30 days) and the Board of Supervisors shall appoint to seats 6-9 as follows:

Seat 1: must be a parent or guardian of a child who is enrolled in a facility that provides early care and education services, which includes child care, early care, preschool, infant and toddlers care;

Seat 2: must be a representative of the San Francisco Unified School District’s Early Education Division, or any successor to that division, recommended by the Superintendent of Schools to the Mayor. If the Superintendent of Schools fails to make a recommendation within 90 days of a vacancy the Mayor may appoint a person to hold this seat;

Seat 3: must be an early care and education provider that serves infants and toddlers ages zero to three;

Seat 8: must be a family support provider, a provider or educator who works with children with special needs, a community member with expertise in early education, a member of the mental health community specializing in early care, a member of a philanthropic organization, which has an emphasis on early care and education issues, or a member of the business community with an interest in early care and education issues; and

Term of Office: The Commission members shall serve five-year terms. No person appointed as a Commission member may serve as such for more than two successive five-year terms. Any person appointed as a commission member to complete more than two and one half years of a five-year term shall be deemed to have served one full term. In the event a vacancy occurs, the appointing authority who appointed the member vacating the office shall appoint a qualified person to complete the remainder of the term. All members initially appointed shall take office on January 1, 2002.

The Elections Commission shall oversee all public federal, state, district and municipal elections in the City and County. Such appointees are not precluded from being appointed as members of the legislative body of other enhanced financing districts established by City ordinance.*

The EIFD Public Financing Authority No. 1 shall serve as the governing body for the Power Station EIFD and, in that capacity, shall be responsible for the duties as are imposed by California Government Code Sections 53398.50 et seq., including, but not limited to, (i) causing the preparation of, adopting, and implementing the Infrastructure Financing Plan ("Power Station IFP") for the Power Station EIFD, which will describe, among other things, the allocation by the City to the Power Station EIFD of certain incremental property tax revenue for the purpose of funding public capital facilities and other specified projects of communitywide significance that provide significant benefits to the Power Station EIFD or the surrounding community, (ii) the issuance by the Power Station EIFD of bonds and other forms of indebtedness in furtherance of the purposes of the Power Station EIFD, (iii) causing the timely preparation and delivery of the annual report required by Government Code Section 53398.66(j), and (iv) causing the timely preparation and delivery of the independent audit required by Government Code Section 53398.88.

To the extent permitted under applicable law, the EIFD Public Financing Authority No. 1 shall act as the legislative body of other enhanced infrastructure financing districts formed in the City pursuant to California Government Code Section 53398.51, on such terms and conditions as the Board of Supervisors shall determine by ordinance and as otherwise set forth in the proceedings establishing such infrastructure financing districts.

The members shall serve six-year terms, provided that the first five commissioners to be appointed to take office on the first day of February 2002 shall by lot classify their terms so that the term of one commissioner shall expire at 12:00 noon on each of the second, third, fourth, fifth and sixth anniversaries of such date, and on the expiration of these and successive terms of office, the appointments shall be made for six-year terms. In the event of a vacancy, the officer who appointed the member vacating the office shall appoint a qualified person to complete the remainder of the term.

Members of the Commission shall be officers of the City and County, and may be removed by the appointing authority only pursuant to Section 15.105. No person may serve more than one six-year term as a member of the Commission, provided that persons appointed to fill a vacancy for an unexpired term with less than three years remaining or appointed to an initial term of three

or fewer years shall be eligible to be appointed to one additional six-year term. Any term served before the effective date of this Section shall not count toward a member's term limit. Any person who completes a term as a Commissioner shall be eligible for reappointment six years after the expiration of his or her term.

It also administers an education program, provides advice on the laws, and produces compliance materials. It also audits statements to ensure compliance, investigates alleged violations of laws within its jurisdiction, and assesses late fees and penalties for failure to adhere to the laws' requirements. The Commission also administers the City's public campaign financing system for candidates seeking election to City office.

The Family Violence Council (Council) was established to advise and submit recommendations to the Board of Supervisors that address the problems of family violence. Family violence includes child abuse, domestic violence, and elder/dependent adult abuse. The Council may also advise the courts of the City and County and the Mayor by submitting recommendations to improve the response by departments to family violence and abuse. The general purpose of the Council is to: (1) increase the awareness and understanding of family violence (and its consequences) by establishing a series of roundtables, forums, meetings, or summits that identify, highlight, and discuss critical issues pertaining to family violence so as to broaden understanding of family violence and its causes and consequences among the public, governmental agencies, courts, and community organizations; (2) recommend programs and policies that promote communication and coordination of City and community-based organizations' services relating to child abuse, domestic violence, and elder/dependent adult abuse; and (3) recommend programs, policies, and coordination of City services to the Board of Supervisors and Mayor that may reduce the incidence of family violence in San Francisco.

There shall also be Steering Committee who serves as the policy setting body of the Council and is comprised of the three Co-Chairs of the Council, who shall be the Council members serving in Seats 10, 12, and 13.

The Council is composed of 28 members, or his/her designee, as follows:

The Food Security Task Force was established to recommend legislative action and city-wide strategies to the Board of Supervisors that would increase participation in federally funded programs such as CalFresh (known nationally as SNAP and formally as food stamps), Summer Food Service, the Child and Adult Care Food Program, the Homeless Children Nutrition Program, the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants and Children (WIC), the School Lunch Program, and the National School Breakfast Program. The Health Service Board shall consist of seven members as follows: one member of the Board of Supervisors, to be appointed by the President of the Board of Supervisors; two members appointed by the Mayor pursuant to Section 3.100, one of whom shall be an individual who

regularly consults in the health care field, and the other a doctor of medicine; one member nominated by the Controller and three members elected from the active and retired members of the System from among their number. Elections shall be conducted by the Director of Elections in a manner prescribed by ordinance. Elected members need not reside within the City and County.

Not later than April 1, 2013 the Controller shall nominate a candidate for appointment to the Health Service Board for a two-year term commencing on May 15, 2013. The Controller shall transmit a written notice of nomination to the Health Service Board. The Controller's nominee shall be subject to the approval of the Health Service Board. If the Health Service Board fails to calendar the Controller's nomination for consideration at a meeting to occur not later than 60 days after receipt of the Controller's written notice of nomination, the Controller's nominee shall be deemed approved. All subsequent appointments of Controller's nominees shall be for a five-year term and be subject to the same procedure. The Controller's nominee may not vote on his or her successor.

The terms of Health Service Board members, other than the ex officio members, shall be five years, and shall expire on May 15 of each year, with the exception that the term of the Board member that begins in May 2011 shall be three (3) years, and shall expire in May 2014, and the term of the Board member that begins in May 2013 term shall be two (2) years, and shall expire in May 2015.

The appointee nominated by the Controller shall succeed the elected member whose term expires at 12:00 noon on May 15, 2013. In the event the elected member whose term expires on May 15, 2013, leaves the Board prior to that date, the Controller shall nominate a successor to fill the unexpired term according to the procedures set forth above.

3. Put such plans as provided for in Section A8.422 into effect and conduct and administer the same and contract therefor and use the funds of the System;

4. Make rules and regulations for the administration of business of the Health Service System, the granting of exemptions and the admission to the System of persons who are hereby made members, and such other officers and employees as may voluntarily become members with the approval of the Board; and

5. Receive, consider and, within 60 days after receipt, act upon any matter pertaining to the policies of, or appeals from, the Health Service System submitted to it in writing by any member or any person who has contracted to render medical care to the members.

Except as otherwise specifically provided, the Health Service Board shall have the powers and duties and shall be subject to the limitations of Charter Sections 4.102, 4.103 and 4.104.

Subject to the requirements of state law and the budgetary and fiscal provisions of the Charter, the Health Service Board may make provision for health or dental benefits for residents of the City and County of San Francisco as provided in Section A8.421.

Proposition J, on the November 4, 2008 ballot, amended the Charter to create an independent Historic Preservation Commission, which shall advise the City on historic preservation matters, participate in processes that involve historic or cultural resources, and take such other actions concerning historic preservation as may be prescribed by ordinance. The proposed Charter amendment would end the service of all current members of the Landmarks Preservation Advisory Board as of December 31, 2008. The Commission shall have the authority to recommend approval, disapproval, or modification of landmark designations and historic district designations under the Planning Code to the Board of Supervisors. The Planning Commission would have 45 days to comment on the HPC recommendation regarding landmarks designations and provide comments to the Board of Supervisors. Certain matters of the Board of Supervisors would be required to be referred to the HPC prior to passage by the Board of Supervisors, including ordinances and resolutions concerning historic preservation issues of historic resources, redevelopment project plans and waterfront plans.

The Historic Preservation Commission shall consist of seven members nominated by the Mayor and subject to approval by a majority of the Board of Supervisors. The original appointments shall have four members with four-year terms and three members with two-year terms as follows: the odd-numbered seats shall be for 4-year terms and the even-numbered seats shall be for 2-year terms. After the expiration of the original terms, all appointments shall be four-year terms, provided however, that a member may holdover until a successor has been nominated by the Mayor and approved by the Board of Supervisors. There shall be no limit on the number of terms a member may serve.

Within 60 days of the expiration of a term or other vacancy the Mayor shall nominate a qualified person to fill the vacant seat subject to approval by a majority of the Board of Supervisors who shall hold a public hearing and vote on the nomination within 60 days of the Mayor's transmittal of the nomination to the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors. If the Mayor fails to make such nomination within 60 days, the nomination may be made by the President of the Board of Supervisors, subject to the approval of a majority of the Board of Supervisors. Members of this Commission shall be persons specially qualified by reason of interest, competence, knowledge,

training and experience in the historic, architectural, aesthetic, and cultural traditions of the City, interested in the preservation of its historic structures, sites and areas, and residents of the City.

- Seats 1 and 2 must be licensed architects meeting the Secretary of the Interior's Professional Qualifications Standards for historic architecture.
- Seat 3 must be an architectural historian meeting the Secretary of the Interior's Professional Qualifications Standards for architectural history with specialized training and/or demonstrable experience in North American or Bay Area architectural history.
- Seat 4 must be a historian meeting the Secretary of the Interior's Professional Qualifications Standards for history with specialized training and/or demonstrable experience in North American or Bay Area history.
- Seat 5 must be a historic preservation professional or professional in a field such as law, land use, community planning or urban design with specialized training and/or demonstrable experience in historic preservation or historic preservation planning.

- Seat 4 shall be held by a person with a record of participation in a merchants' or small business association, or neighborhood association. In addition to the aforementioned qualifications.

At least one of the Mayor's appointees shall have experience in budgeting, finance, and auditing.

Seats 5-7 shall be appointed by the Board of Supervisors:

- Seat 5 shall be held by a person who has personally experienced homelessness.
- Seat 6 shall be held by a person with significant experience providing services to or engaging in advocacy on behalf of persons experiencing homelessness.
- Seat 7 shall be held by a person with significant experience working with homeless families with children and/or homeless youth.

DUTIES:

The Commission shall have the following powers and duties:

- (1) With respect to the Department, the Commission shall exercise all of the powers and duties of boards and commissions as set forth in Sections 4.102, 4.103, and 4.104, including but not limited to, approving applicable departmental budgets, formulating annual and long-term goals consistent with the overall objectives of the City and County, establishing departmental performance standards, holding hearings and taking testimony, conducting public education and outreach concerning programs and services for homeless persons in San Francisco, and issues concerning homelessness, and conducting performance audits of the Department to assess the efficiency and effectiveness of the Department's delivery of services to persons experiencing homelessness and persons participating in programs overseen by the Department, and the extent to which the Department has met the annual goals and performance standards established by the Commission.
- (2) Notwithstanding the Commission's authority to review and set policies, the Commission shall not have the authority to approve, disapprove, or modify criteria used to ascertain eligibility or priority for programs and/or services operated or provided by the Department, where such criteria are required as a condition of the receipt of state or federal funding.

By no later than May 1, 2023, the City shall enact an ordinance that:

- (1) Amends Article XXXI of Chapter 5 of the Administrative Code, to provide that the Commission shall appoint all members of the Local Homeless Coordinating Board ("LHCB") and that the LHCB's sole duties shall be to serve as the Continuum of Care governing body and to advise the Commission on issues relating to the City's participation in the Continuum of Care program. This subsection (h)(1) shall not preclude the City by ordinance from amending said Article XXXI in a manner that is not inconsistent with this subsection or as necessary to comply with federal requirements relating to the Continuum of Care.
- (2) Amends Article XII of Chapter 20 of the Administrative Code, to provide that the Shelter Monitoring Committee shall advise the Commission in lieu of advising the LHCB. This subsection (h)(2) shall not preclude the City by ordinance from amending said Article XII in a manner that is not inconsistent with this subsection.
- (3) Amends Article XLI of Chapter 5 of the Administrative Code and Section 2810 of Article 28 of the Business and Tax Regulations Code, to provide that the Our City, Our Home Oversight Committee ("Oversight Committee") shall advise and make recommendations to the Commission and the Health Commission, in addition to advising and making recommendations to the Mayor and the Board of Supervisors, on administration of the Our City, Our Home Fund ("Fund") and on monies appropriated from the Fund, which monies are subject to the City budget

approval process set forth in Article IX of the Charter, and to provide that the needs assessment conducted by the Oversight Committee shall inform the Department's strategic planning process. This subsection (h)(3) shall not preclude the City by ordinance from amending said Article XLI and said Section 2810 in a manner that is not inconsistent with this subsection, Section 2811 of the Business and Tax Regulations Code, and Articles XIII A and XIII C of the California Constitution, as may be amended from time to time.

The references in subsection (h) to the LHCB, Shelter Monitoring Committee, and Oversight Committee do not change their character as bodies created by ordinance. Accordingly, they are not subject to provisions in the Charter or Municipal Code that apply exclusively to bodies enumerated in the Charter or created by the Charter, including but not limited to Charter Sections 4.101.1 and 4.101.5.

Within one year of the effective date of the ordinance adopted by the Board of Supervisors in compliance with subsection (h), the City Attorney shall cause subsections (h)-(j) of this Section 4.133 to be removed from the Charter.

It has been past practice that six (6) of the immigrant members are appointed by the Board of Supervisors and two (2) immigrant members are appointed by the Mayor. All members must have a demonstrated knowledge of and interest in the health, human service, educational, or employment issues that affect immigrants residing in San Francisco and shall reflect the geographic, ethnic, and sexual orientation population of San Francisco.

The term of each member of the Commission shall be two years; provided, however, that the members first appointed shall, by lot, classify their terms so that eight (8) members shall serve a term of three years and seven (7) members shall serve a term of two years. The Inclusionary Housing Technical Advisory Committee was established to advise the City Controller on the triennial Economic Feasibility Analysis (Analysis) on the City's inclusionary affordable housing obligations set forth in Planning Code, Section 415 et seq. The Analysis shall include sensitivity analyses of key economic parameters that can vary significantly over time, such as, but not limited to: interest rates; capitalization rates; equity return rates; land prices; construction costs; project scale, available state and federal housing finance programs including Low Income Housing Tax Credits readily available for market rate housing; tax exempt bond financing; Federal Housing Administration and U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development mortgage insurance; available City or local housing finance programs, such as Enhanced Infrastructure District and tax increments; zoning changes that increase or decrease development potential; variable City exactions, including community benefit fees, capacity charges, community facilities districts; the value of state density bonus, concessions and incentives under California Government Code Section 65915 and any other state law that confers value to development and which project sponsors may attempt to avail themselves of; and public-private partnership development agreements where applicable and other factors as deemed reasonably relevant. The first Analysis shall be submitted to the Board of Supervisors by July 31, 2016, and by October 31st for subsequent years. Thereafter, the Controller shall repeat this process at least every 36 months, or more frequently as deemed necessary by the Controller in response to a significant shift in economic or market conditions.

The governing body of the In-Home Supportive Services (IHSS) Public Authority shall be composed of thirteen (13) members appointed by the Board of Supervisors. The Metropolitan Transportation Commission consists of 19 members, one voting member of whom is appointed by the Board of Supervisors and must be an officer or employee of the City and County of San Francisco. Sixteen of the nineteen members are voting members.

The composition of the members are as follows: Fourteen voting members are appointed directly by local elected officials. In each of the more populous counties, Alameda, Contra Costa, San Francisco, San Mateo and Santa Clara -- two commissioners are appointed, one by the county's council of mayors and council members (in San Francisco, by the mayor) and one by the county board of supervisors. In each of the less populous counties, Marin, Napa, Solano and Sonoma-- the county's council of mayors and council members nominates up to three candidates to the board of supervisors, which selects one commissioner. Because of this system, most commissioners are local elected officials. In addition, one voting representative each is appointed by the Association of Bay Area Governments and the San Francisco Bay Conservation and Development Commission.

The three nonvoting members are as follows: One representative of the state's Business, Transportation and Housing Agency, as well as the federal Department of Housing and Urban Development, and the United States Department of Transportation.

The MTC was created to plan the transportation network for the nine Bay Area counties. In addition to preparing a long-range plan, MTC looks at specific travel routes, weighs the relative merits of various travel options (new rail or roads, or upgrades to what is already in place), then decides on the needed improvements.

Compensation: \$100 for each meeting with a limit of 5 meetings a month for reimbursement.

Reports: The Commission adopted a regional transportation plan for the region. Any new transportation project in the region must be included in the plan before it can move forward. Each county within the jurisdiction of the commission, together with the cities and transit operators within the county, may, every two years, develop and update the transportation plan for the county and the cities within the county. The commission shall develop an emergency transportation system management plan which defines the continuing emergency services required during reconstruction of highway facilities which have been rendered inoperable by the earthquake. The plan shall be in effect for the period of time needed to restore the damaged sections of State Route 880 in the County of Alameda and State Route 280 and the Embarcadero Freeway in the City and County of San Francisco.

The Our City, Our Home Oversight Committee (“Committee”) was established by passage of Proposition C in the November 6, 2018 General Municipal Election, which amended the Business and Tax Regulations Code, Section 2810, that envisioned the establishment of the Committee. The Committee monitors and provides advice regarding the administration of the Our City, Our Home Fund (“Fund”), which collects monies under the Homelessness Gross Receipts Tax Ordinance, codified in the Business and Tax Regulations Code, Article 28.

The Committee shall have the following purposes and duties: (a) all the purposes and duties as set forth in Business and Tax Regulations Code, Sections 2810(e)(1) and (2); (b) identify barriers to safe and successful exits out of homelessness, and propose ways to reduce those barriers or the impact of those barriers; (c) solicit substantive input from people who are Homeless regarding spending priorities; (d) conduct needs assessments in accordance with Business and Tax Regulations Code, Section 2810(e)(2)(B); and (e) in conjunction with each needs assessment report, at least 60 days before issuing the report, the Committee shall provide a draft of the report to each City department discussed in the report, and allow the department 30 days to provide a written response to the Committee.

The Committee shall be comprised of nine (9) voting members, as follows:

- Seat 1: Shall be an individual with experience with homeless housing development or supportive housing services, appointed by the Mayor.
- Seat 2: Shall be an individual representing families with minor children residing in SRO units or a family member residing in a SRO unit, appointed by the Board of Supervisors.
- Seat 3: Shall be an individual with experience providing homeless services, appointed by the Mayor.
- Seat 4: Shall be an individual who has experienced homelessness and also has experience advocating for homeless people, appointed by the Board of Supervisors.
- Seat 5: Shall be an individual with mental health service and/or substance abuse expertise, appointed by the Mayor.
- Seat 6: Shall be an individual who has personally experienced homelessness, appointed by the Board of Supervisors.
- Seat 7: Shall be an individual who has personally experienced homelessness, appointed by the Mayor.

- Seat 8: Shall be an individual who has experience advocating on homeless or mental health issues, appointed by the Board of Supervisors.
- Seat 9: Shall be an at large seat, appointed by the Controller.

Members shall serve for two-year terms, except for the initial terms which shall be staggered based on the odd and even numbering.

The Director of the OCC may verify and file disciplinary charges with the Police Commission against members of the Police Department arising out of citizen complaints that are sustained by the OCC after meeting and conferring with the Chief of Police.

The Public Works Commission shall consist of five seats:

The Reentry Council was created to coordinate local efforts to support adults exiting San Francisco county jail, San Francisco juvenile justice system out-of-home placements, the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation facilities, and the United States Federal Bureau of Prison facilities.

The Council shall provide the Mayor, Board of Supervisors, the public, and any other appropriate agency with accurate and comprehensive information about programs that serve this population, barriers faced by this population, best practices to meet the needs of this population, and funding sources for programs and practices that address the needs of this population. The Council shall coordinate information sharing, planning, and engagement among all interested private and public stakeholders to the extent permissible under federal and state law.

The Council shall consist of 25 members, seven (7) of whom shall be former inmates in the San Francisco County Jail, a California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation facility, and/or a United States Bureau of Prison facility.

The Mayor, or the Mayor's designee, shall serve as a member of the Council, and the Mayor shall also appoint three of the seven members who are formerly incarcerated persons referenced in subsection 5.1-3(a)(1). Of these three members, at least one must be between the ages of 18 to 35, inclusive, at the time of appointment and have been a person incarcerated before the age of 24, and at least one shall have expertise in providing services to individuals exiting the criminal justice system.

The Board of Supervisors, or on the Board's motion its designee referenced in subsection 5.1-3(a)(4), shall appoint as a member of the Council a representative of the entity or agency primarily responsible for administering pretrial services involving alternatives to incarceration in San Francisco.

The Board of Supervisors shall designate one (1) of its members to serve as a member of the Council and shall appoint four (4) of the seven (7) members who are former inmates. Of these four (4) members:

- One (1) shall have expertise in providing services to individuals exiting the criminal justice system;
- One (1) must have been released from custody within three years of his/her appointment;
- One (1) must have served multiple terms of incarceration; and
- One (1) must self-identify as a survivor of violence or crime.

All members of the Council shall be exempt from the Charter requirement that they be electors of the City and County of San Francisco (added by Ordinance No. 26-09).

The following City departments or agencies shall appoint one (1) member each to the Council: Public Defender's Office; District Attorney's Office; Sheriff's Department; Police Department; Adult Probation Department; Juvenile Probation Department; Department of Economic and Workforce Development; Human Services Agency; Department of Children, Youth and Families; Department of Public Health; and Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing (11 total).

In addition, co-chairs shall invite the San Francisco Superior Court, Department of Child Support Services, California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation Division of Adult Parole Operations, and United States Probation and Pretrial Services System to appoint one (1) member each to the Council. If any of these agencies do not appoint a representative, the co-chairs shall appoint an additional member (4 total).

Members shall serve two-year terms and shall serve at the pleasure of the appointing authority. Members may serve multiple terms. If any member misses two regularly scheduled meetings in a twelve-month period without prior notice, the Council shall certify that fact in writing to appointing authority and the member shall be deemed to have resigned.

DESCRIPTION:

The road commissioner shall each year prepare a tentative road budget covering all proposed expenditures for the ensuing fiscal year for county road purposes.

DUTIES:

The road commissioner shall submit the budget to the board of supervisors in accordance with Chapter 1 (commencing with Section 29000) of Division 3 of Title 3 of the Government Code and in the form and manner prescribed by the Controller and at the same time as other county departments submit their recommended budgets.

The Board of Supervisors shall hold public hearings on the proposed road budget at the same time as the general county budget is considered and after like notice. In adopting the budget, the board may make such changes and revisions as it considers will subserve the public interest.

After adoption of the budget by the Board of Supervisors, the road commissioner shall not obligate or expend funds appropriated for county road purposes other than as set forth in the budget as adopted. However, the board of supervisors may, by appropriate action at any regular or special meeting, authorize the cancellation or transfer, in whole or in part, of any appropriation or appropriations set forth in the budget and reappropriate funds thus canceled for road purposes not set forth in the budget or to expenditure classifications insufficiently provided for where this action will best serve the interests of the people. Funds transferred pursuant to this section, or as authorized by the board of supervisors, shall immediately be made available for expenditure by the road commissioner for road purposes.

REPORTS:

None.

SEAT INFORMATION:

The Board of Supervisors of each county shall appoint a single road commissioner for all road districts in the county. Every person who is appointed road commissioner after December 31, 1965, shall be a registered civil engineer. However, the City and County of San Francisco may appoint a person road commissioner who is not a registered civil engineer. Any person appointed road commissioner on or before December 31, 1965, need not be a registered civil engineer if he or she is approved by the board of supervisors as qualified and competent to handle the road and highway work of the county. Any person who is a road commissioner in any county on December 31, 1965, need not be a registered civil engineer to be appointed road commissioner of another county after December 31, 1965. After October 1, 1952, no person shall be appointed road commissioner until the board of supervisors holds a public hearing on the qualifications of the candidate or candidates for the position of road commissioner. At least 14 days but

not more than 30 days prior to the hearing, notice of the hearing shall be posted at the county courthouse and published at least once in a newspaper of general circulation in the county. Nothing in this section precludes one person from serving two or more counties. An elective county official shall not be appointed road commissioner after October 1, 1952, unless the official is holding the position of road commissioner on that date. The road commissioner is, at all times, under the direction and supervision of the board of supervisors but may be dismissed, after a hearing, only upon a majority vote of the board. This subdivision does not apply in chartered counties whose charter requires the county surveyor to perform the duties of, or exercise the powers conferred by law on, the road commissioner.

The San Francisco Board of Supervisors authorized and declared that all future appointments of the City and County of San Francisco Road Commissioner and repeal of any legislation related thereto shall occur by Resolution. Further, upon the Mayoral appointment of a new, interim, or acting Director of the Department of Public Works, that person shall serve as acting Road Commissioner until the Board of Supervisors Resolution appointing a new Road Commissioner is final and effective. (Ordinance No. 211-13)

The San Francisco Sentencing Commission (Commission) was established to encourage the development of criminal sentencing strategies that reduce recidivism, prioritize public safety and victim protection, emphasize fairness, employ evidence-based best practices, and efficiently utilize San Francisco's criminal justice resources.

The Commission shall consist of twelve (12) members, or thirteen (13) members if the Superior Court agrees to provide one member, as follows: CITY DEPARTMENT OR GOVERNMENT AGENCY (Department Head/Chairperson, or his/her designee)

- District Attorney
- Public Defender
- Adult Probation

- Juvenile Probation
- Sheriff
- Police
- Department of Public Health
- Reentry Council
- Superior Court PUBLIC MEMBERS
- One (1) member of a nonprofit organization that works with victim, appointed by the Family Violence Council
- One (1) member of a nonprofit organization that works with ex-offenders, appointed by the Reentry Council
- One (1) member must be a sentencing expert, appointed by the Board of Supervisors
- One (1) member must be an academic researcher with expertise in data analysis, appointed by the Mayor

The Commission shall have the following powers and duties:

- a) Review and assess sentencing approaches locally and compare to other jurisdictions.
- b) Review and assess the City's capacity and utilization of services and alternatives to incarceration throughout the criminal justice continuum, including pre-adjudication and post release.
- c) Review and assess the Justice Reinvestment Initiative recommendations to invest in best practices to reduce recidivism.
- d) Develop a recommended system of uniform definitions of recidivism for City departments to track and report on the outcomes of various criminal sentences and City programs meant to aid in reducing recidivism.
- e) Develop data collection standards and recidivism reporting standards.
- f) Develop and recommend department specific goals to reduce recidivism for the City departments represented on the Sentencing Commission, and other relevant City department.
- g) Make recommendations regarding changes that should be made to the Penal Code and any other state laws to remove barriers to effective implementation of best practices in criminal justice.
- h) Facilitate trainings on best practices in sentencing for various criminal justice agencies.
- i) Share information and work in collaboration with the Reentry Council and the Community Corrections Partnership.
- j) On an annual basis, submit a report to the Mayor and the Board of Supervisors summarizing the findings of the Commission and making recommendations on the aforementioned categories.
- k) Nothing in Administrative Code, Article XXV, shall infringe on any agency's legally mandated responsibilities in the criminal justice system and, as such, recommendations are not statutorily binding on any City department.

The District Attorney's Office shall provide staff support and administrative assistance to the Commission. The District Attorney, or the staff member of the District Attorney serving on the Commission, shall also chair the Commission.

The Commission shall meet at least three times a year. All public members shall serve at the pleasure of their appointing authority and can be removed at any time, with or without cause.

Report: On an annual basis the Commission shall submit a report to the Mayor and the Board of Supervisors summarizing the findings of the Commission and making recommendations on matters within their powers and duties.

Sunset: The Commission was set to expire on June 30, 2023, unless the Board of Supervisors chose to adopt an ordinance continuing its existence. The Commission submitted a report to the Board of Supervisors in December 2022 recommending that the Commission should continue to operate. On July 10, 2023, the Board of Supervisors voted unanimously to reauthorize the Commission. The Commission's new sunset date is June 30, 2026.

Members of the Rules Committee will consider the appointment(s) at the meeting and applicant(s) may be asked to state their qualifications. The appointment of the individual(s) who is recommended by the Rules Committee will be forwarded to the Board of Supervisors for final approval.

The general purpose of the South of Market Community Planning Committee shall be to provide input to the Board of Supervisors, the Mayor, and City agencies regarding the implementation of the Central SoMa Plan, Western SoMa Area Plan, and East SoMa Area Plan. The City agencies to

which the Committee may provide input include, but are not limited to, the Planning Department, the Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development, the Office of Economic and Workforce Development, the Municipal Transportation Agency, the Recreation and Park Department, the Department of Public Works, the Arts Commission, and the Interagency Planning and Implementation Committee. The Committee's prioritization of revenue expenditures described in subsection (b) below that are collected from development projects in the Central SoMa Plan Area shall be consistent with the Central SoMa Implementation Program document.

The South of Market Community Planning Advisory Committee shall consist of eleven (11) members and eleven (11) alternate members who shall represent the cultural diversity of the East SoMa, Central SoMa, and Western SoMa neighborhoods, and ideally will include renters of residences in the neighborhoods, resident homeowners in the neighborhoods, low-income residents, local merchants, and representatives of established neighborhood groups within the East SoMa, Central SoMa, and Western SoMa Plan Areas.

Seven (7) Seats shall be nominated by the District 6 Supervisor and appointed by the Board of Supervisors as follows:

- Seat 1 shall be held by an individual who has small business expertise.
- Seat 2 shall be held by an individual with familiarity and experience in infrastructure and/or safety, as relating to pedestrians, bicyclists, or transit.
- Seat 3 shall be held by an individual who has familiarity and experience in historic preservation and/or cultural preservation.
- Seat 4 shall be held by an individual who has familiarity and experience in development and/or management of affordable housing.
- Seat 5 shall be held by an individual who provides direct social services to SoMa residents.
- Seats 6 and 7 shall have no additional required qualifications.

Four (4) seats shall be appointed by the Mayor.

- Seat 8 shall be held by an individual with a record of advocacy for parks, recreation, and open space in San Francisco.
- Seat 9 shall be held by an individual who has expertise in employment development or represents labor interests.
- Seats 10 and 11 shall have no additional required qualifications

There shall be 11 alternate members of the Committee, one designated for each of the 11 seats. Alternate members shall be appointed for their respective seats in the same manner as the regular members.

Additional Qualifications: All members shall live, work, or own a business within the boundaries of the East SoMa, Central SoMa, or Western SoMa Area Plans. When fully constituted, at least three members shall live within the boundaries of the East SoMa, Central SoMa, or Western SoMa Area Plans.

- One (1) shall be an attorney and
- one (1) shall be a journalist.
- One (1) member shall be a member from the press or electronic media.
- One (1) member shall be a journalist from a racial/ethnic-minority-owned news organization and nominated by New California Media.
- One (1) member nominated by the local chapter of the League of Women Voters.
- Two (2) members of the public experienced in consumer advocacy.

The City Attorney’s Office shall assign an attorney to the Task Force who is experienced in public-access law matters and serve as a legal advisor and advocate to the Task Force.

The term of each appointed member shall be two years unless removed by the Board of Supervisors. In the event of such removal or vacancy during the term of office of any appointive member, a successor shall be appointed for the unexpired term of the office vacated.

In addition to regular Task Force meetings, Task Force members are expected to participate in committee work.

On February 1, 1999, by Resolution No. 89-99, the Board of Supervisors directed the Treasure Island Development Authority (TIDA) to adopt a resolution providing for the formation of the Treasure Island Development Authority Citizens Advisory Board (TIDA CAB).

TIDA CAB is purposed to gather public input and opinions from the diverse communities in San Francisco and provide expertise to TIDA. Specifically, TIDA CAB provides recommendations to TIDA concerning the implementation of the Redevelopment Plan for the Treasure Island Naval Station, including policies and objectives for interim reuses, and other matters of importance to the future of Treasure Island and all citizens of San Francisco. When providing advice and recommendations, the TIDA CAB shall strive to reflect the values and interests of the various communities throughout the City and County.

TIDA CAB is comprised of 25 members, 11 of whom shall be appointed by the Board of Supervisors and 14 of whom shall be appointed by the Mayor.

TIDA CAB is comprised of members with the following areas of interest and expertise:

- land use and urban planning and architecture;

The Urban Forestry Council protects the community interest and ensures that San Francisco realizes the full range of tree benefits into the future. Council members will represent the full range of urban forest stakeholders, including City agencies, non-profit organizations, tree management organizations, and community members.

The Urban Forestry Council shall be comprised of fifteen (15) voting members, seven (7) of whom are appointed by the Board of Supervisors, as follows:

- One (1) member from an educational organization involved with tree management (University of California Cooperative Extension, etc.);
- Two (2) members certified by a professional tree management organization (International Society of Arboriculture, American Society of Consulting Arborists, or American Society of Landscape Architects);
- Two (2) members of non-profit organizations involved in urban forestry or other environmentally related issues; and
- Two (2) members from the community.

The Mayor shall appoint two (2) voting members, as follows:

- One (1) member from the tree care industry; and
- One (1) member at large.

The following Director or General Manager of each of the following departments, or his/her designee, shall each serve as a voting member:

- Director of the Department of Public Works (1);
- Director of the Planning Department (1); and
- General Manager of the Recreation and Park Department (1).

The following bodies shall also appoint a voting member:

- Public Utilities Commission (1);
- Golden Gate National Recreation Area (GGNRA) (if GGNRA does not make an appointment within 60 days after the seat is vacant, the Presidio Trust may appoint a voting member to serve that term; if the Presidio Trust does not make an appointment within 30 days after it is authorized to do so, the Mayor shall appoint an at-large member to fill the seat) (1); and

Reports: Before the Board of Supervisors takes final action on any matter that primarily affects children and youth of San Francisco, the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors shall refer the matter to the Commission for comment and recommendation. The Commission shall provide a response within 12 days of the referral date; after the 12 day period the Board may act on the matter whether or not a response was received. This requirement shall not apply to matters where immediate action is necessary to protect the public interest. Also, by July 1st of each calendar year the Commission shall report to the Board of Supervisors on their activities, goals, and accomplishments.
