Next Steps: Applicants who meet minimum qualifications will be contacted by the Rules Committee Clerk once the Rules Committee Chair determines the date of the hearing. Members of the Rules Committee will consider the appointment(s) at the meeting and applicant(s) may be asked to state their qualifications. The appointment of the individual(s) who is recommended by the Rules Committee will be forwarded to the Board of Supervisors for final approval.

The Graffiti Advisory Board consists of twenty-five (25) voting members who shall be appointed as follows:

- One (1) member shall be the Mayor or his/her designee;
- Eleven (11) persons appointed by individual members of the Board of Supervisors, with each Member of the Board making one appointment, to serve a term of two years (these appointments shall be effective when written notice of the appointment is received by the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors); and
- The Board of Supervisors shall appoint the following members, who shall serve a term of two years:
 - One (1) employee, officer or member of a youth groups who provide services for juveniles involved in alternative programs for graffiti diversion;
 - One (1) employee, officer or member of a nonprofit organizations that provide services related to the City's beautification and neighborhood cleanup programs;

- Two (2) members representing businesses that operate in San Francisco, one of whom must be a own the property where his/her business operates;
- One (1) employee or officer of a private school or art school that operates in San Francisco;
- One (1) employee or officer of the contracting agency for Municipal Railway shelters; and
- One (1) at-large member.

The following officials and organizations shall each appoint one (1) member to serve on the Advisory Board:

- The Director of Transportation of the Municipal Transportation Agency,
- The Director of Public Works,
- The General Manager of the Recreation and Park Department,
- The District Attorney
- The Chief of Police, and
- The Board of Education of the San Francisco Unified School District may appoint one member. (If the Board of Education fails to appoint a member within 60 days of a vacancy, the Board of Supervisors shall appoint a student, teacher, or member of the San Francisco Unified School District academic branch.)

Each member of the Advisory Board shall serve at the pleasure of the member’s appointing authority and may be removed by the appointing authority at any time.

Reports: Prepare and submit a report to the Board of Supervisors and the Mayor every year on graffiti, as it affects neighborhoods and the downtown area of San Francisco, which shall include a review and evaluation of the services and programs in place to respond to graffiti, prevention strategies, recommendations, and plans for a consolidated program of public and private efforts; advise about the coordination of information, activities and goals among existing programs funded by the City and County and privately sponsored programs; and advise about improving the efficiency in the provision of graffiti enforcement, prevention, and clean-up services.
