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¹ Under the [CDPH Vaccination Status Order](#), “worker” includes, but is not limited to nurses, nursing assistants, physicians, technicians, therapists, phlebotomists, pharmacists, students and trainees, contractual staff not employed by the health care facility, and persons not directly involved in patient care, but who could be exposed to infectious agents that can be transmitted in the health care setting (e.g., clerical, dietary, environmental services, laundry, security, engineering and facilities management, administrative, billing, and volunteer personnel).

² Under the SF [Safer Return Together Order](#), “Personnel” refers to all persons who routinely work onsite, including those who are not permanently stationed or regularly assigned to a High-Risk Setting, but who in the course of their duties may enter or work in High-Risk Settings even on an intermittent or occasional basis or for short periods of time. Personnel also includes those persons working in buildings at a site containing a High-Risk Setting, such as a campus or other similar grouping of related buildings, where Personnel do any of the following: (i) access the acute care or patient, resident, client, or incarcerated person areas of the High-Risk Setting; or (ii) work in-person with patients, residents, clients, or incarcerated people who visit those areas. **Personnel “who are not permanently stationed or regularly assigned to a High-Risk Setting, but who in the course of their duties may enter or work in High-Risk Settings even on an intermittent or occasional basis or for short periods of time” are not required to be vaccinated until **October 13, 2021**. These individuals do not fall within the state’s definition of “workers.”
