250140 [Planning Code, Zoning Map - Projecting Signs in Neighborhood Commercial and Residential-Commercial Districts]

Sponsors: Sherrill; Sauter, Melgar and Mandelman

Ordinance amending the Planning Code to allow two projecting signs for all corner businesses in all Neighborhood Commercial and Residential-Commercial Districts citywide, and abolishing the 2301 Chestnut Street Special Sign District; amending the Zoning Map to reflect that District's abolition; affirming the Planning Department's determination under the California Environmental Quality Act; and making findings of consistency with the General Plan, and the eight priority policies of Planning Code, Section 101.1, and findings of public necessity, convenience, and welfare under Planning Code, Section 302. ASSIGNED UNDER 30 DAY RULE to Land Use and Transportation Committee.

Resolution approving and authorizing the Director of the Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development ("MOHCD") to execute loan documents for the permanent financing of 1135, 1155 and 1175 Ellis Street pursuant to the Small Sites Program and the Preservation and Seismic Safety Program, for a total loan amount not to exceed \$50,600,000; confirming the Planning Department's determination under the California Environmental Quality Act; finding that the loan is consistent with the General Plan, and the eight priority policies of Planning Code, Section 101.1; and authorizing the Director of MOHCD or their designee to make certain modifications to the loan documents, and take certain actions in furtherance of this Resolution, as defined herein. (Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development). RECEIVED AND ASSIGNED to Budget and Finance Committee.

250143 [Execute Standard Agreement and Accept and Expend Grant - Retroactive - California Department of Housing and Community Development - Round 3 Homekey Grant - 42 Otis Street - Not to Exceed \$8,225,095]

Resolution authorizing the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing ("HSH") to execute a Standard Agreement with the California Department of Housing and Community Development having anticipated revenue to the City in a total amount not to exceed \$8,225,095 of Project Homekey grant funds; to retroactively accept and expend those funds for the acquisition of the property located at 42 Otis Street for permanent supportive housing and to support its operations for costs incurred March 3, 2021, through June 30, 2026; approving and authorizing HSH to commit approximately \$8,710,632 in required matching funds for acquisition of the property and a minimum of 10 years of operating subsidy; affirming the Planning Department's determination under the California Environmental Quality Act; and adopting the Planning Department's findings of consistency with the General Plan, and the eight priority policies of Planning Code, Section 101.1; and authorizing HSH to enter into any additions, amendments, or other modifications to the Standard Agreement and the Homekey Documents that do not materially increase the obligations or liabilities of the City or materially decrease the benefits to the City. 250144 [Accept and Expend In-Kind Gift - Consulting Services - Various Providers - Valued at \$337,920]

Resolution authorizing the Mayor's Office, through the Mayor's Office of Innovation, to accept in-kind gifts of consulting services from ZS Associates valued at \$168,960 and Adobe valued at \$168,960 for a total value of \$337,920 from February 26, 2025, through June 13, 2025, in connection with the Civic Bridge Program; and to authorize the Mayor's Office of Innovation to enter into amendments or modifications to the donor agreement that do not materially increase the obligations or liabilities to the City and are necessary to effectuate the purposes of the donor agreement or this Resolution. 250145 [Agreement - New Flyer of America, Inc. - Battery-Electric Buses - Not to Exceed \$13,424,512]

Resolution approving an agreement between the City and County of San Francisco, acting by and through the San Franciso Municipal Transportation Agency (SFMTA) with New Flyer of America, Inc., to procure four 40-foot and three 60-ft battery-electric buses, along with spare parts, special tools, manuals, training, and telematics licenses through a cooperative purchasing agreement established by the State of Washington for an amount not to exceed \$13,424,512 and a term not to exceed five years, effective upon approval of this Resolution; and authorizing SFMTA to enter into any amendments or other modifications to the agreement that do not materially increase the obligations or liabilities, or materially decrease the public benefits accruing to the SFMTA and are necessary or advisable to effectuate the purposes of the Resolution. Ordinance authorizing settlement of the lawsuit filed by Coinbase, Inc. against the City and County of San Francisco for \$1,600,000; the lawsuit was filed on January 10, 2025, in San Francisco Superior Court, Case No. CGC-25-621382, entitled Coinbase, Inc. v. City and County of San Francisco et al.; the lawsuit involves a refund of gross receipts, homelessness gross receipts, and overpaid executive gross receipts taxes; other material terms of the settlement relate to Coinbase Inc.'s filing position and tax liability for the 2024 tax year. 250117 [Settlement of Lawsuit - Lester Hogan - \$50,000]

Ordinance authorizing settlement of the lawsuit filed by Lester Hogan against the City and County of San Francisco for \$50,000; the lawsuit was filed on February 18, 2021, in United States District Court, Northern District of California, Case No. 22-cv-6112-DMR (NMC); entitled Lester Hogan v. Deputy Ibarra; the lawsuit involves alleged civil rights violations; the City already paid \$25,000 to Plaintiff, and the City will pay \$25,000 to Kaiser Foundation Health Plan, Inc. (via the Rawlings Company) to satisfy a Medicare Advantage lien for Plaintiff's medical treatment relating to the incident. (City Attorney).
