250424 [Administrative Code - Establishing the Board of Directors - San Francisco Downtown Revitalization and Economic Recovery Financing District]

Sponsors: Mayor; Mandelman, Dorsey, Mahmood, Sauter and Sherrill

Ordinance amending the Administrative Code to establish and define the membership and duties of the Board of Directors of the San Francisco Downtown Revitalization and Economic Recovery Financing District. ASSIGNED UNDER 30 DAY RULE to Rules Committee.

250425 [Public Works Code, Administrative Code - Fee Waiver - Detroit Street Steps Archway]

Ordinance amending the Public Works Code to waive the Tier 3 Love Our Neighborhoods major encroachment permit fee for a project to install the Detroit Street Steps Archway in the Sunnyside neighborhood that will create a gateway for the Detroit Street Steps Project; amending the Administrative Code to waive the Board of Appeals surcharge for this permit; and affirming the Planning Department's determination under the California Environmental Quality Act. ASSIGNED UNDER 30 DAY RULE to Land Use and Transportation Committee.

250426 [Planning Code, Zoning Map - San Francisco Gateway Special Use District]

Ordinance amending the Planning Code and the Zoning Map to establish the San Francisco Gateway Special Use District generally bounded by Kirkwood Avenue to the northeast, Rankin Street to the southeast, McKinnon Avenue to the southwest, and Toland Street to the northwest; making findings under the California Environmental Quality Act; making findings of consistency with the General Plan, and the eight priority policies of Planning Code, Section 101.1; and making findings of public necessity, convenience, and welfare under Planning Code, Section 302. ASSIGNED UNDER 30 DAY RULE to Land Use and Transportation Committee.

250427 [Development Agreement - Prologis, L.P. - San Francisco Gateway Project - Toland Street at Kirkwood Avenue]

Sponsors: Walton; Engardio, Fielder, Chen and Melgar

Ordinance approving a Development Agreement between the City and County of San Francisco and Prologis, L.P., a Delaware limited partnership, for the development of an approximately 17.1-acre site located at Toland Street at Kirkwood Avenue with two multi-story production, distribution, and repair buildings in a core industrial area, including 1,646,000 square feet of production, distribution, and repair, space for non-retail sales and service, automotive, and retail uses, a rooftop solar array, ground-floor maker space, and streets built to City standard; making findings under the California Environmental Quality Act; making findings of conformity with the General Plan, and with the eight priority policies of Planning Code, Section 101.1(b); making findings of public convenience, necessity, and welfare under Planning Code, Section 302; approving certain development impact fees for the Project and waiving certain Planning Code fees and requirements; and confirming compliance with or waiving certain provisions of Administrative Code, Chapter 56, Chapter 14B, Chapter 82, Chapter 83, and Chapter 23; and ratifying certain actions taken in connection therewith, as defined herein. ASSIGNED UNDER 30 DAY RULE to Land Use and Transportation Committee.

Resolution of Intention to establish San Francisco Downtown Revitalization and Economic Recovery Financing District ("District") to finance commercial-to-residential conversion projects and other authorized costs, determining the boundaries of the District, stating the need for the District and goals the District proposes to achieve, describing the use of property tax revenue that will be used to finance the District's activities, authorizing the Director of the Office of Public Finance to request the President of the Board of Supervisors to establish the time and date for a public hearing on the plan, and making related findings. Resolution authorizing the Recreation and Park Department to accept and expend cash and/or in-kind grants from the San Francisco Irish Famine Memorial Committee valued at approximately \$500,000 for the San Francisco Irish Famine Memorial Project, effective upon approval of this Resolution through notice of substantial completion. (Recreation and Park Department). RECEIVED AND ASSIGNED to Budget and Finance Committee.

Resolution 1) approving and authorizing the sale of an approximately 46,097-square-foot portion of the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission's (SFPUC) Parcel 21, located in South San Francisco, California, for \$132,000 to the City of South San Francisco; 2) adopting findings declaring that the property is "exempt surplus land" and "surplus land" under the State Surplus Lands Act (California Government Code, Section 54220 et seq); 3) adopting findings under the San Francisco Administrative Code, Section 23.3, that offering the property for sale through competitive bidding would be impractical and not in the public interest; 4) adopting findings that the sale is consistent with the General Plan, and the eight priority policies of Planning Code, Section 101.1; 5) authorizing the SFPUC General Manager and/or City's Director of Property to execute a Purchase and Sale Agreement and Quitclaim Deed, make certain modifications, and take certain actions in furtherance of this Resolution, as defined herein; and to authorize the SFPUC General Manager and/or City's Director of Property to enter into any additions, amendments, or other modifications to the Sale Agreement that do not materially decrease the benefits to the City with respect to the Property, and do not materially increase the obligations or liabilities of either the SFPUC or the City, and are necessary or advisable to complete the transaction contemplated in the Sale Agreement, to effectuate the purpose and intent of this Resolution.
