Supervisor Peskin, seconded by Supervisor Safai, moved that this Ordinance be AMENDED, AN AMENDMENT OF THE WHOLE BEARING NEW TITLE, by renaming the City's 'Slope Protection Act' to 'Slope and Seismic Hazard Zone Protection Act', changing the application of the protection from properties that 'exceeds an average slope of 25%' to properties that 'exceed an average slope of '4 horizontal to 1 vertical', expanding the mandatory review requirements that may be imposed by the Department of Building Inspection, adding review by a Structural Advisory Committee and specifying their considerations, changing the regulations to implement the Slope and Seismic Hazard Zone Protection Act, and making other clarifying and conforming changes.
