The existing program taxes some businesses a flat amount, some a flat amount plus an amount for each employee. amount for each employee, some a flat amount plus an amount based on the number amount based on the number, size or value of a business component or product, and some are taxed only on gross receipts subject to a minimum amount. A limited number of businesses making number of businesses making less than \$1,500 are exempt from paying tax. Nearly all businesses are required to pay a minimum of \$341. The existing program generates general fund revenues of approximately \$1.2 million annually. The City Council

unanimously determined to submit to the citizens of Belmont for their approval this measure restructuring the business license tax. If approved the Measure will reduce and reorganize the business categories into four and establish rates for all categories based only on gross receipts derived from business activity within the city. The rates for all businesses except cannabis range between up to \$0.40 and \$1.00 per \$1,000.00 of gross receipts. The Measure will establish a separate category for cannabis businesses with a rate of up to \$100.00 per \$1,000 of gross receipts. The Measure neither allows nor prohibits such businesses. Businesses with less than \$10,000 in gross receipts will not pay tax. The proposed gross receipt tates will lower the total amount paid by the majority of businesses and are expected to generate approximately the same revenue as the current tax. The Measure's revenue will be used exclusively by the city for general governmental purposes and may not be taken by the state. The restructured tax would remain in place until changed by the voters.
