3 **Motion authorizing preparation of written Proponent ballot arguments and rebuttal**
4 **ballot arguments for submittal to the voters for the June 7, 2022, Statewide Direct**
5 **Primary Election.**

7 WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors wishes to authorize the listed Board Member(s)
8 or sponsor, supporting the following ballot measure(s), to prepare and submit a written
9 proponent ballot argument(s) and proponent rebuttal argument(s) for submittal to the Director
10 of Elections:

- 11 ▪ Charter Amendment (Third Draft) to amend the Charter of the City and County of
12 San Francisco to revise the duties, composition, and method of appointment for
13 members of the Building Inspection Commission; and affirming the Planning
14 Department's determination under the California Environmental Quality Act; at an
15 election to be held on June 7, 2022. (Board File No. 211286) (Supervisor Melgar)
- 16 ▪ Charter Amendment (Third Draft) to amend the Charter of the City and County of
17 San Francisco to extend the ban on the initiation of recall petitions from six to
18 twelve months after the official has assumed office; prohibit the submission of a
19 recall petition to the Department of Elections, if the subsequent recall election would
20 be required to be held within twelve months of a regularly scheduled election for the
21 office held by the official sought to be recalled; and provide that any interim officer
22 appointed to fill a vacancy created by a recall election, held on or after June 7,
23 2022, may not be a candidate in the subsequent vacancy election; at an election to
24 be held on June 7, 2022. (Board File No. 211287) (Supervisor Peskin)

- 1 ▪ (General Obligation Bond) Ordinance calling and providing for a special election to
2 be held in the City and County of San Francisco on Tuesday, June 7, 2022, for the
3 purpose of submitting to San Francisco voters a proposition to incur the following
4 bonded indebtedness of the City and County: \$400,000,000 to finance the costs of
5 construction, acquisition, and improvement of certain transportation, street safety
6 and transit related capital improvements, and related costs necessary or convenient
7 for the foregoing purposes; authorizing landlords to pass-through 50% of the
8 resulting property tax increase to residential tenants under Administrative Code,
9 Chapter 37; applying provisions of Administrative Code, Section 6.27, requiring
10 certain funded projects to be subject to a Project Labor Agreement; providing for the
11 levy and collection of taxes to pay both principal and interest on such bonds;
12 incorporating the provisions of Administrative Code, Sections 5.30 through 5.36,
13 setting certain procedures and requirements for the election; finding that the
14 proposed bond is not a project under the California Environmental Quality Act
15 (CEQA); and finding that the proposed bond is in conformity with the eight priority
16 policies of Planning Code, Section 101.1(b), and with the General Plan consistency
17 requirements of Charter, Section 4.105, and Administrative Code, Section 2A.53.

- 19 ▪ (Initiative Ordinance, Board Proposed) Ordinance to amend the Police Code to
20 require employers to provide public health emergency leave during a public health
21 emergency. (Board File No. 220022) (Supervisors Mar)
- 22 ▪ (Initiative Ordinance, Board Proposed) Ordinance amending the Refuse Collection
23 and Disposal Ordinance (“the Refuse Ordinance”) to restructure the refuse rate-
24 setting process to replace hearings before the Department of Public Works with a
25 requirement that the Controller, as Refuse Rate Administrator, regularly monitor the

1 rates and appear before the Refuse Rate Board to recommend rate adjustments;
2 establish an appointed Ratepayer Representative to replace the Controller on the
3 Refuse Rate Board; authorize the Refuse Rate Board to set commercial rates;
4 require applicants for refuse collection permits to demonstrate their ability to avoid
5 disruptions in service; clarify existing law regarding refuse collection permits;
6 authorize the Board of Supervisors on recommendation of the Refuse Rate
7 Administrator, Refuse Rate Board, and Mayor to amend the Refuse Ordinance by
8 eight-vote supermajority; and fully codifying the Refuse Ordinance in the Health
9 Code. (Board File No. 220052) (Supervisor Peskin)

- 10 ■ (Initiative Ordinance, 4+ Member Proposed) Ordinance amending the
11 Administrative code to establish the Office of Victim and Witness Rights, and to
12 establish a right to counsel for domestic violence victims in civil proceedings related
13 to limiting the economic, familial, and other harms resulting from domestic violence,
14 and a pilot program to provide civil counsel in such domestic violence-related
15 proceedings through legal services and pro bono attorneys. (Board File No.
16 220063) (Supervisor Stefani)
- 17 ■ (Initiative Ordinance, 4+ Member Proposed) Ordinance amending the Campaign
18 and Governmental Code to expand the prohibition on the solicitation of behested
19 payments to include City contractors seeking the Board of Supervisors' approval
20 and to require approval by the Ethics Commission and super-majority approval the
21 Board of Supervisors for future amendments to local behested payment restrictions.
22 (Board File No. 220110) (Supervisor Peskin)

23 WHEREAS, The Board Member(s) or sponsor authorized by this Motion to submit the
24 ballot argument(s) will submit the proponent argument(s) to the Director of Elections no later
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1 than the deadline of noon, March 17, 2022, and the respective rebuttal proponent ballot
2 argument(s) no later than noon, March 21, 2022; now, therefore, be it

3 MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the Board Member(s) or
4 sponsor listed above, under Municipal Elections Code, Sections 530 and 550, to prepare and
5 submit written proponent ballot argument(s) and respective rebuttal proponent/opponent ballot
6 argument(s) on the listed measures as referenced; and, be it

7 FURTHER MOVED, That the Board Member(s) or sponsor who are authorized by this
8 Motion to prepare and submit proponent ballot argument(s), may authorize or assign to any
9 other person(s) under Municipal Elections Code, Section 550(c) and (d), to prepare and
10 submit the proponent's ballot argument(s) and/or respective rebuttal argument(s).
