Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

Section 1. Environmental Findings.

The Planning Department has determined that the actions contemplated in this ordinance comply with the California Environmental Quality Act (California Public Resources Code Sections 21000 et seq.). Said determination is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 250605 and is incorporated herein by reference. The Board affirms this determination.

Section 2. Article 12 of the Park Code is hereby amended by revising Section 12.01, revising and consolidating Sections 12.02 and 12.03 as Section 12.02; deleting Sections 12.15, 12.27, 12.29, 12.30, 12.39, and 12.48; and revising Sections 12.40, 12.44, and 12.45, to read as follows:

# SEC. 12.01. CAMP MATHER <u>- OVERNIGHT GUESTS-CABIN AND TENT SITE</u> USAGE FEES.

(a) <u>Fees for cabins and tent sites at Camp Mather, and meal fees for overnight guests, shall be</u>
<u>set under Section 12.44.</u> The following use fees, which reflect a discount from the standard fee for
nonresidential usage, shall be charged to San Francisco residents for use of cabin and tent sites at
Camp Mather. The following fees do not include State occupancy tax.

# (b)(d) Cancellation and Processing Fees.

(1) A \$100 deposit shall be required to hold a reservation for each tent site or cabin reserved, to be credited against the total reservation fee owed under subsection (a). The remaining balance of the reservation fee shall be due 30 days before the start of the reservation. Deposits are not refundable, except that the Department shall refund 50% of the deposit if a reservation is cancelled at least 30 days before the reservation start date. For reservations cancelled less than 30 days before the reservation start date and after final payment has been made, the Department shall refund 50% of the reservation fee. Cancellation at least 30 days prior to the arrival date at camp: Deposit is refundable minus a \$50.00 processing fee.:

- (2) Cancellation 30 days prior to the arrival date at camp: No refund of deposit.;
- (3)—Cancellation after final payment: 50 percent of the fees are refundable, no refund of deposit.

(2)(4) A 5% five percent late payment penalty on the total amount due shall be charged to all guests who pay camp and tent site use <u>or meal</u> fees after the final payment due date.

(3)(5) Each change of a reservation: ——\$15.00.

(4)(6) Each unauthorized overnight stay at camp: -\$75.00.

(5)(7) Late check-out: ——\$75.00.

#### SEC. 12.44. RECREATION PROGRAM FEES.

- (a) Authorization to Impose Fees. The Department may set fees under this Section 12.44 for Recreation Programs it may offer to the public, unless otherwise specified in this Article 12, subject to the prior approval of the Recreation and Park Commission. The Department shall publish all approved fees on its website.
- (b) Fees Based on Cost Recovery. The fee for each Recreation Program shall not exceed the estimated Operating Costs of that Program in the coming fiscal year, divided by the total number of slots that the Department will offer in the coming year for that Program; provided, however, that (1) the Department shall seek to recover not more than 50%75% of the estimated Operating Costs of Programs designated for youth or seniors or persons with disabilities, with the exception of Camp Mather, for which the fee may be based on 100% of the estimated Operating Costs; and (2) for all other Programs the Department shall give the highest priority to recovering not more than 50% of the costs of Programs where the Commission has found that a further reduction in the fee is necessary to provide benefits to the community at large.
- (c) Scholarship Policy. The Commission shall review and update its March 2007 Scholarship Policy to provide discounts for Recreation Programs to qualifying San Francisco residents who are

any of the following: (1) members of a household with income equal to or less than 50% of the Area Median Income of San Francisco 250% of the federal poverty level as determined by the United States Department Health and Human Services' Federal Poverty Guidelines, (2) youth in foster care, or (3) unhoused residents. This subsection (c) does not affect Camp Mather Low Income Fee Reductions as set forth in Park Code Section 12.04.

# (d) Definitions.

"Recreation Program" means any class, activity, lesson, program, or similar service that the Department offers to the public.

"Operating Costs" shall consist of the cost to the Department to offer a Recreation

Program, including staff time, expenses, and administrative costs, but shall not include costs related to

any associated capital projects or deferred maintenance projects.

(b) In addition to the hourly fees set forth in subsection (a), there shall also be a \$5 charge for each recreation program, to help cover the cost of said programs.

### SEC. 12.45. RESERVATION ADMINISTRATIVE FEES.

The following administrative fees are applicable to all reservations for Recreation and Park Department programs, activities and facilities, unless otherwise specified:

- (a) A refund processing fee of \$10.00 or 20% percent of the fee, whichever is greater, will be charged when a person requests a refund of program fees.
- (b) A program withdrawal fee of \$10.00 or 20% percent of the fee, whichever is greater, will be charged when a person withdraws from a program or activity.
- (c) There will be  $\underline{A}a$  cancellation fee of \$20.00 or  $20\underline{\%}$  percent of the rental fee, whichever is greater, for the cancellation of facility rental reservations.
  - (d) There will be  $\underline{A}a$  non-refundable application fee of \$50.00 for special event permits.
- (e) *There will be* <u>Aa</u> \$25.00 fee when a reservation for use of an athletic field is rescheduled or canceled.

#### SEC. 12.48. ATHLETIC LEAGUES.

# (a) Definitions.

- (1) Public Benefit Program the activity is offered to low income communities and only nominal fees are charged to ensure commitment to participation.
  - (2) Revenue Program. Fees are charged in order to offset the direct costs of the program.
- (3) For Profit Program Fees are charged in order to cover the direct and indirect costs of the program.
- (b) The following fees shall be charged for participation in athletic leagues. The Recreation and Park Department is authorized to set specific fees within each range based on the type of sport, hours of participation, duration of season, and other Department cost factors:

Public Benefit \$10 25.00 per player \$30 50.00 per player

Revenue Program \$25 50.00 per player \$50 70.00 per player

(c) The following fees shall be charged per team per season for participation in Department leagues:

Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.

# Section 4. Scope of Ordinance.

- (a) In enacting this ordinance, the Board of Supervisors intends to amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles, numbers, punctuation marks, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent parts of the Municipal Code that are explicitly shown in this ordinance as additions, deletions, Board amendment additions, and Board amendment deletions in accordance with the "Note" that appears under the official title of the ordinance.
- (b) The various codified fees presented as existing Code text in Section 2 of this ordinance do not necessarily reflect the fees that are currently applicable. Pursuant to Park Code Section 12.20, the Controller adjusts those fees on an annual basis to reflect changes in the Consumer Price Index. This ordinance is not intended to invalidate any adjustments under Section 12.20 that the Controller has previously approved.

(c) The current fees (including any Controller adjustments to those fees) 20 shall continue to apply, until a cost recovery fee is set with approval of the Recreation and Park Commission under the proposed Section 12.44. Further, the deletion of sections of the Park Code referencing specific program fees in Section 2 of this ordinance does not mean that the Department is prohibited from charging a fee for those programs. The intent of this ordinance is to allow the Department to set fees for those programs under the proposed Section 12.44 instead.

Section 5. Severability.

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this ordinance, or any application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a decision of a court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions or applications of the ordinance. The Board of Supervisors hereby declares that it would have passed this ordinance and each and every section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, and word not declared invalid or unconstitutional without regard to whether any other portion of this ordinance or application thereof would be subsequently declared invalid or unconstitutional.
