[Accept and Expend Grant - United States Department of Transportation - Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity Program - \$20,000,000]

Resolution authorizing San Francisco Public Works to accept and expend a \$20,000,000 grant award from the Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity (RAISE) Program of the United States Department of Transportation to fund the Bayview Connections: Phase 1 Harney Way Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) and Cycletrack Project, which includes transit and active transportation improvements such as roadway widening, dedicated Bus Rapid Transit lanes, protected cycle tracks, and pedestrian infrastructure; approving the grant agreement pursuant to Charter, Section 9.118(a); effective upon approval of this Resolution through December 31, 3031; and affirming the Planning Department's determination under the California Environmental Quality Act.

WHEREAS, The Bipartisan Infrastructure Law, enacted as the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act, Pub. L. No. 117–58, 135 Stat. 429, appropriates significant funding for infrastructure projects, including the Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity ("RAISE") Grant Program, which supports investments in surface transportation projects that have a significant local or regional impact, with an emphasis on sustainability, equity, and economic development; and

WHEREAS, On December 14, 2022, the United States Department of Transportation's Federal Highway Administration ("FHWA") released a Notice of Funding Opportunity for the Fiscal Year 2023 RAISE Discretionary Grant Program; and

WHEREAS, On February 27, 2023, the San Francisco Public Works ("Public Works") submitted an application for the Bayview Connections: Phase 1 Harney Way BRT and Cycletrack project (the "Bayview Connections Project"), which aims to deliver critical

transportation and community improvements, including bus rapid transit ("BRT") lanes, protected cycle tracks, and pedestrian infrastructure as part of the Candlestick Point and Hunters Point Shipyard Phase 2 ("CP/HPS2") project ("CP/HPS2 Project"); and

WHEREAS, On June 28, 2023, the United States Department of Transportation notified the City that the Public Works' application for the Bayview Connections Project had been awarded \$20,000,000 under the RAISE Grant Program to fund the Bayview Connections Project ("RAISE Grant"); and

WHEREAS, The public improvements that will be constructed through the Bayview Connections Project align with the City and County of San Francisco's goals for reducing greenhouse gas emissions, promoting equitable transportation access, and advancing regional connectivity; and

WHEREAS, The award of the RAISE Grant to the City establishes a direct partnership between the City and the FHWA, ensuring streamlined coordination and compliance with federal requirements for the Bayview Connections Project; and

WHEREAS, The Bayview Connections Project is incorporated into the Candlestick Point and Hunters Point Shipyard Phase 2 ("CP/HPS2") Transportation Plan and Design-for-Development that was last approved by the Commission on Community Investment and Infrastructure ("CCII") on October 15, 2019, by Resolution No. 27-2019; and

WHEREAS, On June 3, 2010, the Planning Commission and Former Redevelopment Agency acting as lead agencies under the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") (California Public Resources Code sections 21000 et seq.) and the CEQA Guidelines (14 California Code of Regulations Sections 15000 et seq.), certified a Final Environmental Impact Report (hereinafter "FEIR") for the CP/HPS2 project by Motion No. 18096 and Resolution No. 58-2010, respectively; and at the same hearing the Former Redevelopment Agency and the Planning Commission also adopted findings pursuant to the California Environmental Quality

Act, including a Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program ("MMRP") and a Statement of Overriding Considerations for the Project by Motion No. 18097 and Resolution No. 59-2010, respectively; and on July 14, 2010, the San Francisco Board of Supervisors affirmed the Planning Commission's certification of the FEIR (Motion No. M10-110); and

WHEREAS, Since the certification of the FEIR, the Office of Community Investment and Infrastructure ("OCII"), in consultation with the Planning Department, has issued seven addenda to the FEIR to address project changes, including, most recently, Addendum No. 7, which evaluates the potential environmental effects of the CP/HPS2 Project and recommends modifications to six adopted mitigation measures for reasons set out in Addendum No. 7; and based on the analysis in Addendum No. 7, OCII concluded that the analyses conducted, and the conclusions reached in the FEIR on June 3, 2010, remain valid and the proposed CP/HPS2 Project, including the proposed amendments to the mitigation measures, will not cause new significant impacts not identified in the FEIR, or substantially increase the severity of previously identified significant impacts; and

WHEREAS, According to Addendum No. 7, no CP/HPS2 Project changes have occurred, and no changes have occurred with respect to circumstances surrounding the proposed CP/HPS2 Project, that will require major revisions of the FEIR due to involvement of new significant effects or a substantial increase in the severity of previously identified significant effects, and no new information has become available that shows that the Project will cause new or more severe significant environmental impacts; therefore, Addendum No. 7 concludes that no subsequent or supplemental environmental review is required under CEQA beyond Addendum No. 7 to approve the Project; and

WHEREAS, On September 3, 2024, the Commission on Community Investment and Infrastructure adopted CCII Resolution No. 22-2024, by which the Commission on Community Investment and Infrastructure determined that the analysis conducted and the conclusions

reached in the FEIR as to the environmental effects of the Project, together with further analysis provided in Addendum No. 1, Addendum No. 4, Addendum No. 5, Addendum No. 6, and Addendum No. 7 to the FEIR, remain valid and can be relied upon for approval of the Project in compliance with the CEQA; and

WHEREAS, On September 12, 2024, having reviewed and considered the CEQA findings including the statement of overriding considerations that it previously adopted in the Planning Commission adopted Motion No. 18097, the findings in Addendum No. 7, and the findings in CCII Resolution No. 22-2024, the Planning Commission adopted Motion No. 21067 and found that the actions contemplated by Motion No. 21607 are included in the actions identified in CCII Resolution 22-2024 for purposes of compliance with CEQA; and the Planning Commission, in Motion No. 21607, adopted the additional CEQA findings in CCII Resolution 22-2024 as its own, including approving the modifications to the six adopted mitigation measures recommended for modification in Addendum No. 7; said Motion No. 21607, including the CEQA findings therein, which were not submitted with this Resolution and these items will be submitted for inclusion in the Board File; and

WHEREAS, OCII shall reimburse any indirect costs incurred by the City in relation to the RAISE Grant; and

WHEREAS, On January 7, 2025, the Director of Public Works issued Order No 211321 (the "Order") recommending that the Board of Supervisors approve the acceptance of the Project, make the certifications required by the U.S. Department of Transportation as a condition of awarding the grant, and authorize the Department of Public Works to enter into the Grant Agreement on behalf of the City and to authorize the Department and the Clerk of the Board to take further actions as may be deemed necessary by the Grantor before the City may accept and expend the grant funds for the Project as set forth in the legislative package;

said Order is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 250035 and is incorporated herein by reference; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, Due to incomplete documentation in the Accept and Expend submission, the funds accepted for this grant shall be placed into the Board of Supervisors' reserve until released; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That Board of Supervisors finds that the approval of the actions contemplated by this resolution are included in the actions identified in CCII Resolution No. 22-2024 for purposes of compliance with CEQA, and the Board of Supervisors hereby adopts the additional CEQA Findings in CCII Resolution No. 22-2024 as its own, including approving the modifications to the adopted mitigation measures recommended for modification in Addendum No. 7; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors, pursuant to Charter, Section 9.118(a), hereby approves the Grant Agreement with the United States Department of Transportation in an amount of \$20,000,000, and authorizes the Director of Public Works or the Director's designee to execute all required documents; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, Once all outstanding documents have been submitted, the Board of Supervisors delegates their authority to release these funds to the Budget and Finance Committee and the Clerk of the Board is directed to schedule a hearing at the Budget and Finance Committee to duly review the complete file and submitted documents and consider the release of the funds to the Department of the Environment; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the Director of Public Works, or the Director's designee, to conduct negotiations and to execute and submit all documents that may be necessary for the completion of the Project, including but not limited to applications, agreements, amendments, and payment requests; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Director of Public Works or the Director's designee is authorized to execute all required documents, including the Grant Agreement with the FHWA, and to take further actions in accordance with federal requirements; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, The Board of Supervisors hereby waives inclusion of indirect costs in the grant budget; and

FURTHER RESOLVED, That San Francsico Public Works shall be hereby authorized to expend the grant award of \$20,000,000 upon the release of funds from the Board of Supervisors' Reserve; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, The Board of Supervisors certifies that Public Works will maximize the use of available grant funds on program expenditures by adhering to the indirect cost principles outlined in 2 CFR § 200.414; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Director of Public Works or the Director's designee is authorized to execute all required documents, including the Grant Agreement with the United States Department of Transportation for the RAISE Grant, and to take further actions in accordance with federal requirements; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That within 30 days of the Grant Agreement being executed by all parties, Public Works shall provide the final agreement to the Clerk of the Board for inclusion in File No. 250035.
