

1 [Accept In-Kind Grant - San Francisco Parks Alliance - John McLaren Bike Park, Phase I -
2 \$147,268]

3 **Resolution authorizing the San Francisco Recreation and Park Department to accept an**
4 **in-kind grant of \$147,268 from the San Francisco Parks Alliance to support the John**
5 **McLaren Bike Park.**

7 WHEREAS, The San Francisco Recreation and Park Department (RPD) operates and
8 maintains real property owned by the City and County of San Francisco (Assessor's Parcel
9 Block No. 6220, Lot No. 002) commonly known as John McLaren Park; and

10 WHEREAS, Within John McLaren Park there is a parcel of land approximately 80,000
11 square feet in size located between Sunnydale Avenue and Santos Street that is currently
12 used as an illegal dumping site; and

13 WHEREAS, The McLaren Bike Park Founders (Founders), the San Francisco Parks
14 Alliance (SFPA), and RPD have collaborated over the past four years to establish San
15 Francisco's first dedicated BMX/Mountain Bike Park at that site; and

16 WHEREAS, RPD and the Founders have been working to raise the \$1,131,922 needed
17 to complete the project; and

18 WHEREAS, The Founders have raised a total of \$147,268 to complete conceptual
19 design and provide construction documents for the project which will be granted in-kind to
20 RPD; and

21 WHEREAS, The SFPA, as a California nonprofit public benefit corporation, acts as
22 fiscal sponsor for the Founders, and

23 WHEREAS, RPD submitted successful grant applications for the MBP project to the
24 Land and Water Conservation Fund and Jumping Fences; and

1 WHEREAS, Additional funds for the project were provided by the 2008 and 2012 Clean
2 and Safe Park Bonds and Supervisor Avalos's Office; and

3 WHEREAS, As of July 20, 2016, the sum of all funds identified for the project stands at
4 \$1,131,922; and

5 WHEREAS, On March 23, 2013, the Planning Department issued a Certificate of
6 Determination that the project is categorically exempt from the requirements of the California
7 Environmental Quality Act; and

8 WHEREAS, On June 16, 2016, the Recreation and Park Commission adopted
9 Resolution No. 1606-004, approving the conceptual design for the project, approving the
10 Grant Agreement between RPD and SFPA for the implementation of the project, approving
11 the donor recognition plan, and recommending that the Board of Supervisors accept the in-
12 kind grant from SFPA valued at \$147,268; and

13 WHEREAS, The terms and conditions for Design and Construction of the project are
14 detailed in the Grant Agreement; and

15 WHEREAS, RPD proposes to maximize the use of available grant funds on project
16 expenditures by not including indirect costs in the grant budget; now, therefore, be it


17 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors authorized the Recreation and Park
18 Department to accept the in-kind grant from SFPA valued at \$147,268 for the McLaren Bike
19 Park, Phase I project, and to perform all acts required of the City thereunder; and, be it

20 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors waives inclusion of the indirect
21 costs in the grant budget; and, be it


22 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors authorizes the Recreation and
23 Park General Manager to enter into any modifications to the in-kind Grant that the Recreation
24 and Park General Manager determines, in consultation with the City Attorney, are in the best
25 interests of the City and do not materially increase the obligations or liabilities of the City, are


1 necessary or advisable to effectuate the purposes of the in-kind Grant or this Resolution, and
2 are in compliance with all applicable laws, including the City's Charter.

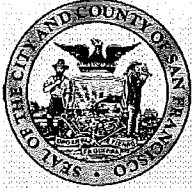


