Resolution declaring Black Maternal Health Week from April 11 through April 17, 2025, in the City and County of San Francisco.

[Black Maternal Health Week - April 11 through April 17, 2025]

WHEREAS, Black women in San Francisco deserve joyful, healthy pregnancies and birth outcomes just like every other racial demographic; and

WHEREAS, Black maternal health disparities in San Francisco are a multidimensional challenge that requires a community-centered approach; and

WHEREAS, Black women are the only racial group for whom preterm birth has gotten worse in San Francisco since 2020; and

WHEREAS, Black maternal health disparities in San Francisco are rooted in systemic racism; and

WHEREAS, The death of a mother during or within the following year of a pregnancy from a pregnancy-related complication is called pregnancy-related mortality; and

WHEREAS, The number of pregnancy-related deaths for every 100,000 live births, or the pregnancy-related mortality ratio, is often used as an indicator to measure the health and well-being of a nation and a municipality; and

WHEREAS, In San Francisco, there is one pregnancy-related death each year; and WHEREAS, In San Francisco, the top three causes of maternal death are embolism, infection, and chronic disease, including cancers and hypertension, which in turn are associated with economic, cultural, environmental, and social conditions; and

WHEREAS, 45% of Black/African American birthing mothers live below the federal poverty line in San Francisco; and

WHEREAS, Inordinate and unacceptable disparities exist in the rate of pregnancyrelated mortality by race and ethnicity; and

WHEREAS, In San Francisco, Black/African American birthing mothers experience a disproportionate share of pregnancy-related deaths; and

WHEREAS, Over the past 10 years, Black/African American mothers had about 4% of births but accounted for 50% of pregnancy-related deaths; and

WHEREAS, The Maternal, Child and Adolescent Health section of the Department of Public Health has convened a group of multi-sector stakeholders to participate in the Prenatal Equity Initiative to implement strategies to decrease disparities in maternal mortality, preterm birth, and other perinatal health issues; and

WHEREAS, Care coordination, education, and access to social and health care services can improve perinatal health in San Francisco; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That addressing Black maternal health disparities is a solvable problem in San Francisco; and

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby declares April 11 through April 17 as "Black Maternal Health Week" to affirm the City's commitment to investing in and protecting the lives of all birthing people in San Francisco.
