[Jewish American Heritage Month - May 2025]

Resolution declaring the month of May 2025 as Jewish American Heritage Month in the City and County of San Francisco and honoring the contributions of Jewish Americans to the cultural, civic, and historic fabric of the city.

WHEREAS, Jewish American Heritage Month is a time to honor the generations of Jewish Americans who have enriched the cultural, civic, and spiritual life of our country, including here in San Francisco, where the Jewish community has been an integral piece of the City since its earliest days; and

WHEREAS, In the mid-1800s, thousands of Jewish immigrants, many fleeing persecution in Central Europe arrived in a young, rapidly growing San Francisco during the Gold Rush where they found opportunity, community, and a rare sense of acceptance in contrast to many other American cities where Jews faced deep discrimination, San Francisco welcomed them as part of its founding story; and

WHEREAS, These early Jewish San Franciscans became merchants, civic leaders, and philanthropists, shaping the city alongside their neighbors; and

WHEREAS, By the 1870s, San Francisco had the second largest Jewish population in the U.S., and the city became known as the birthplace of a uniquely Western, secular, and reform-minded Jewish identity; and

WHEREAS, Jewish San Franciscans continue to connect to their Jewish identity in a variety of ways, such as culturally, ethnically, religiously and by following Jewish ethics and values; and

WHEREAS, Jewish San Franciscans are racially, ethnically, socially, politically and economically diverse, and around 25% of Bay Area Jewish households include a person of color; and

WHEREAS, Jewish communities have faced persistent discrimination, scapegoating, and violence, including a troubling rise in antisemitic rhetoric and attacks in recent years; and

WHEREAS, In 2024, nationwide antisemitic incidents, including physical attacks, vandalism, and verbal, online and physical harassment reached all-time highs according to the Anti-Defamation League (ADL), and 42% of surveyed Bay Area Jews directly witnessed or experienced antisemitism in the past year according to the Jewish Community Relations Council (JCRC); and

WHEREAS, Implicit bias and antisemitic attitudes contribute to this rise in antisemitism, with 67% of Bay Area Jews surveyed by JCRC in 2024 reporting that people make assumptions about them because they are Jewish, and in 2024 the ADL found 24% of Americans surveyed endorsed six or more anti-Jewish tropes; and

WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco stands firmly against antisemitism and all forms of hate, and reaffirms its commitment to being a safe, inclusive, and welcoming city for people of all faiths, ethnicities, and identities; and

WHEREAS, Jewish American Heritage Month invites us not only to celebrate the achievements of Jewish Americans, but to reflect on the ongoing need to defend democratic values, fight bigotry, and build bridges across communities; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors hereby recognizes the month of May 2025 as Jewish American Heritage Month in the City and County of San Francisco, and honors the resilience, contributions, and rich cultural legacy of Jewish Americans, past, present, and future; and

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors will continue efforts to confront antisemitism and other forms of hate impacting the Jewish community, support local education about the diversity of our Jewish community, and integrate Jewish culture into future programs, activities, and ceremonies throughout the year.
