[Accept and Expend Grant - Retroactive - California Energy Commission - Electric Vehicle Charging Infrastructure for Government Fleets - \$5,047,167]

Resolution retroactively authorizing the Office of the City Administrator to accept and expend a grant award in the amount of \$5,047,167 from April 21, 2025, through June 30, 2028, from the State of California Energy Commission for electric vehicle charging infrastructure for government fleets.

WHEREAS, The California Energy Commission has recognized the need for electric vehicle charging infrastructure grant funding for local governments in California; and

WHEREAS, The Office of the City Administrator's Fleet Management Department oversees citywide fleet management policies and supports departmental fleet managers to implement these policies; and

WHEREAS, The City's fleet of light duty passenger vehicles includes roughly 3,000 assets across 34 City departments, of which roughly sixty percent (60%) are gasoline powered vehicles that City departments are working to transition to electric vehicles; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 4 of the San Francisco Environment Code on Healthy Air and Clean Transportation Program outlines the requirements for San Francisco's light duty fleet to be fully Zero Emissions by December 31, 2022 (Section 4.03 of the Fleet Management Promoting Healthy Air and Clean Transportation); and

WHEREAS, City Departments may apply for waivers with reasonable justification such as the lack of charging infrastructure on City-owned property (Section 404(b)(4) regarding New or Replacement Motor Vehicles), which has been the leading hurdle to transitioning to Zero Emissions Vehicles; and

WHEREAS, The Department of Fleet Management proposes to maximize the use of available grant funds on program expenditures by not including indirect costs in the grant budget; and

WHEREAS, The grant does not require an Annual Salary Ordinance amendment; and WHEREAS, With the California Energy Commission's grant in the amount of \$5,047,167 to purchase and install 403 EV charger ports for City fleet on City-owned property, City departments will be able to purchase electric vehicles without being hindered by infrastructure challenges; and

WHEREAS, Matching funds are in the amount of \$2,828,859 and will come from eligible personnel costs and non-professional services costs, as well as match funds from the Annual Capital Plan budget, the Port, Public Utilities Commission, and Municipal Transportation Agency; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Office of the City Administrator is hereby retroactively authorized under Administrative Code, Section 10.170-1 to accept and expend up to \$5,047,167 of California Energy Commission funds to procure and install 403 EV charger ports on Cityowned property; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives inclusion of indirect costs in the grant budget; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby retroactively approves the grant agreement with the California Energy Commission included in File No. 250321 with a total not to exceed amount of \$5,047,167 for a grant term of April 21, 2025, through June 30, 2028; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby approves inclusion of match costs in the amount of \$2,828,859 in the project budget drawn from eligible personnel costs and non-professional services costs, as well as matching funds from the Annual Capital

Plan budget, the Port, the Public Utilities Commission, and the Municipal Transportation Agency, bringing the entire project budget to \$7,876,026; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the Deputy City Administrator to execute by electronic signature on behalf of the Fleet Management Department and the City and County of San Francisco the grant agreement included in the official file, and any extensions or amendments to the grant agreement; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That any liability arising out of the performance of this contract, including civil court actions for damages, shall be the responsibility of the grant recipient and the authorizing agency; the California Energy Commission and the State of California disclaims responsibility for any such liability.
