Resolution adding the commemorative street name "Dr. Howard Thurman Way" to the 2020 Block of Stockton Street in recognition of Dr. Howard Thurman's legacy in San Francisco.

WHEREAS, Dr. Howard Thurman was and remains one of San Francisco's most prominent religious and academic leaders and spiritual thinkers, a worldwide inspiration and mentor whose influence as a philosopher, theologian, educator, author, and civil rights leader continues today; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Thurman was born in a segregated Florida community in 1899, became valedictorian of his class both at Morehouse College and at Rochester Theological Seminary, and established a reputation as a thinker, teacher, and international lecturer; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Thurman became Dean of Rankin Chapel at Howard University and later Dean of Marsh Chapel at Boston University, the first African American dean at a predominantly white university; and

WHEREAS, As part of a delegation to India, Burma, and Ceylon in 1935-1936, Dr. Thurman and his wife, Sue Bailey Thurman, were the first African Americans to spend time with Mohandas Gandhi and discuss with him the use of nonviolent resistance to effect social change in the United States; and

WHEREAS, Inspired by his conversation with Gandhi, Dr. Thurman accepted the urgent invitation of San Francisco State University Professor and Presbyterian Pastor, Dr. Alfred Fisk, to leave his prestigious career in academia and move to San Francisco in 1944 as cofounding Pastor of The Church for the Fellowship of All Peoples in San Francisco, the nation's first avowedly interracial, interfaith congregation; and

WHEREAS, Fellowship Church became a worldwide model for interracial and interfaith cooperation, a cornerstone of San Francisco's cutting-edge reputation for social equity, and a force against racial injustice and disparities which is still active today at 2041 Larkin Street; and

WHEREAS, Dr. and Mrs. Thurman established the Howard Thurman Educational Trust, with its office at 2020 Stockton Street, San Francisco, to fund research for literary, religious, and scientific purposes and scholarships for African American students from economically challenged families and communities; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Thurman authored twenty-two books in his lifetime which remain influential among prominent civil rights, education, religious, and social service leaders - including Jesus and the Disinherited, which was often carried by Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.-as well as among the general public; and

WHEREAS, In addition to the memorials at Washington National Cathedral,
Morehouse College, and the Howard Thurman Center for Common Ground at Boston
University, Dr. Thurman has been honored by a 1990 bronze sculpture above the entrance to 235 Pine Street which commemorates citizens who have contributed significantly to San Francisco's history; and

WHEREAS, Life Magazine rated Dr. Thurman among the twelve most important religious leaders in the United States, and Ebony Magazine called him one of the 50 most important figures in African American history; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That in order to publicly recognize the legacy and contributions of Dr. Howard Thurman, there shall be an honorary naming of "Dr. Howard Thurman Way" on the 2020 Block of Stockton Street at the intersection of Stockton Street and Pfeiffer Street; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Department of Public Works is directed to add the honorary street name to its official list of Commemorative Street Names in accordance with Public Works Code, Section 789 et seq.
