[Firearm Suicide Prevention Day - September 12, 2023]

Resolution retroactively recognizing September 12, 2023, to be Firearm Suicide Prevention Day in remembrance of the lives lost to firearm suicide, acknowledgement of the individuals, families, and communities who have been impacted, and to spread awareness about the growing firearm suicide crisis.

WHEREAS, On Tuesday, September 13, 2022, National Firearm Suicide Prevention day was established by Brady and End Family Fire; and

WHEREAS, Everytown for Gun Safety reports that access to a firearm triples one's risk of death by suicide, a risk that extends to all individuals in a household, not solely the gun owner; and

WHEREAS, Firearm suicide represents a preventable public health crisis that can be addressed through meaningful legislation from our local, state, and federal levels of government; and

WHEREAS, Implementing and enforcing safe storage and extreme risk protection laws plays a vital role in reducing the incidence of gun violence, including firearm suicides; and

WHEREAS, One study reveals that households securing both firearms and ammunition witness a 78 percent reduction in self-inflicted firearm injuries and an 85 percent decrease in unintentional firearm injuries among youth, compared to those who secure neither; and

WHERAS, According to the National Library of Medicine, while 8.5 percent of suicidal acts result in fatality nationwide, this statistic surges to an alarming 89.6 percent mortality rate when a firearm is involved; and

WHEREAS, The Pew Research Center reports that suicides have consistently accounted for more than half of the gun-related deaths in the United States; and

WHEREAS, Globally, the U.S. ranks second in firearm-related suicides, with over 44 percent of such suicides occurring with its borders in 2019; and

WHEREAS, The COVID-19 pandemic has seen a rise in gun suicide rates across various racial groups, disproportionately affecting young Black, Indigenous, and people of color (BIPOC); and

WHEREAS, Everytown for Gun Safety, Moms Demand Action, End Family Fire, and Brady have tirelessly researched, advocated, litigated, and organized for more than a decade to combat gun violence across the U.S., including gun suicides; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors hereby solemnly designates September 12th to be Firearm Suicide Prevention Day, with the intention of amplifying advocacy and illuminating an issue often veiled in stigma; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors hereby commends and supports the unwavering efforts of Moms Demand Action, Brady, End Family Fire, and Everytown for Gun Safety in their quest to address this pressing crisis; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors hereby urges individuals to stay informed, stay active, and spread awareness thereby contributing to the cessation of firearm suicides.
