[Maria Branyas Day - November 7, 2023]

Resolution commending San Francisco-born supercentenarian, Maria Branyas, the world's oldest known living person; and declaring November 7, 2023, as "Maria Branyas Day" in the City and County of San Francisco.

WHEREAS, Maria Branyas was born on March 4, 1907 in San Francisco, California, to an expatriate Spanish family (of Catalan origin) who moved to San Francisco in 1906 after the Great Earthquake and Fire, looking for economic opportunities to ensure their family thrived; and

WHEREAS, With San Francisco in ruins and struggling to rebuild itself after the 1906 earthquake and fire, Maria Branyas' family eventually moved on to New Orleans, and then finally relocated back to Spain in 1915; and

WHEREAS, Due to the German naval presence in the Atlantic Ocean during the First World War, the family's boat was rerouted through Cuban waters and the Azores in order to ensure safe passage, and Maria's father died of tuberculosis on the extended lengthy voyage, while Maria herself lost her hearing in one ear after falling from the upper deck down to the lower deck while playing with her brothers; and

WHEREAS, Maria Branyas' mother remarried after the death of her husband at sea, and the family subsequently settled first in Barcelona, Spain and subsequently moved northeast to the city of Banyoles in Spain; and

WHEREAS, In July of 1931, Maria Branyas married a traumatologist named Dr. Joan Moret with whom she had three children, August, Maria Teresa, and Rosa; and

WHEREAS, During the Spanish Civil War, Maria Branyas was employed as a nurse working by her husband's side at a Nationalist field hospital in Trujillo, Extremeadura, and

later as a nurse and her husband's assistant when he became the director of the Josep Hospital in Girona, until his death in 1976; and

WHEREAS, In the 1990s, Maria Branyas travelled to Egypt, Italy, the Netherlands, and England, taking up hobbies such as sewing, music and reading; and

WHEREAS, In 2000, at the age of 93, she moved to a nursing home in Olot, Catalonia, after contracting pneumonia, where she thrived as an active and engaged resident, continuing to perform exercises until her mobility eventually deteriorated; and

WHEREAS, Maria Branyas played the piano until she was 108 years of age, and now uses a voice-to-text platform to communicate due to hearing loss; and

WHEREAS, Maria Branyas has 11 grandchildren, and has already outlived her eldest son, August, who died in a tractor accident at the age of 86; and

WHEREAS, Maria Branyas became a centenarian in 2007, and a supercentenarian by 2017, which is achieved by about one in 1,000 centenarians; and

WHEREAS, Maria Branyas became the then-oldest person to contract and recover from COVID-19 in March of 2020, and used the experience to call for better medical and social treatment of the elderly, at a time in the pandemic when many doctors across the world were struggling with choices about who to prioritize aiding with limited healthcare resources and a strained healthcare workforce, telling *The Observer*, "This pandemic has revealed that older people are the forgotten ones of our society. They fought their whole lives, sacrificed time and their dreams for today's quality of life. They didn't deserve to leave the world in this way."; and

WHEREAS, In July 2020, a research study into the impact of the coronavirus pandemic on elderly care home residents conducted by the Spanish National Research Council and Dalt Pharmacy, was dubbed *Proyecto Branyas* ('Project Branyas') in honor of Maria Branyas and her example and advocacy; and

WHEREAS, Maria Branyas officially became the oldest living person in the world on January 17, 2023, after the death of Lucile Randon of France, and became the oldest person to have ever resided in Spain on April 21, 2023 after surpassing Ana María Vela Rubio, and she became the oldest emigrant ever on May 14, 2023 after surpassing Tekla Juniewicz; and

WHEREAS, Maria Branyas continues to inspire the world with her longevity, perseverance, good humor, quick wit, vast institutional knowledge, verve and deep wisdom earned from a life well-lived, including filmmakers like Academy Award-nominated documentarian, Sam Green, who has chronicled her impact and that of other supercentenarians in film, and she has continued to intrigue the scientific and medical communities who have made her the ongoing subject of scientific research as a result of her lack of health or memory issues despite her advanced age; and

WHEREAS, When asked about the secret to her long life, Maria Branyas credits an intentional life of "order, tranquility, good connection with family and friends, contact with nature, emotional stability, no worries, no regrets, lots of positivity, and staying away from toxic people."; and

WHEREAS, San Francisco is proud to call itself the birthplace of the world's oldest living person, Maria Branyas, who will be 116 years and 246 days on the final adoption of this resolution, and has much to teach us all at this critical moment in our planet's history on how to live with integrity, love, humanity, and hope; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco commends San Francisco-born supercentenarian, Maria Branyas, the world's oldest known living person and declares November 7, 2023 as "Maria Branyas Day" in the City and County of San Francisco.
