[Roger Casement Day - October 28, 2025]

Resolution recognizing October 28, 2025, as Roger Casement Day in the City and County of San Francisco.

WHEREAS, Roger Casement was an Irish patriot, diplomat and pioneering activist for the human rights of indigenous peoples; and

WHEREAS, The Casement Report, written by Casement in 1904, detailed the abuses in the Congo Free State against the Congolese population, including the atrocities committed by colonial administrators under the rule of King Leopold II of Belgium, and was instrumental in Leopold relinquishing his private holdings in Africa and ending the exploitation of the Congo for its natural resources; and

WHEREAS, Casement was knighted in 1911 for his investigations of human rights abuses in the rubber industry in Peru; and

WHEREAS, Casement was an Irish revolutionary and in 1905 joined the Sinn Féin party, which called for an independent Ireland, and organized public and political support on behalf of Ireland's efforts to achieve independence; and

WHEREAS, In 1914, Casement traveled to Germany and negotiated the government's public support for Irish independence and, while there, worked to recruit an Irish Brigade that would be trained to fight against Britain in the cause of Irish Independence and secure shipments of arms and ammunition; and

WHEREAS, Casement was martyred for his role in the 1916 Easter Uprising, one of the most significant uprisings in Ireland and the first armed conflict of the Irish revolutionary period; and

WHEREAS, Casement was stripped of his knighthood in June of 1916, executed on August 3, and was buried in the prison cemetery; and

WHEREAS, in 1965, Casement's remains were repatriated to Ireland and despite the annulment of his title, the 1965 UK Cabinet record of his repatriation refers to him as "Sir Roger Casement"; and

WHEREAS, Despite the stripping of his title, attempts to malign him for his homosexuality, and his execution for acts of treason, Roger Casement is remembered fondly for his efforts to expose and end the colonial atrocities in the Congo and the Putomayo region and his pioneering activism; and

WHEREAS, The Consulate General of Ireland, Neale Richmond, TD, Ireland's Minister of State for International Trade and Diaspora, and the Rainbow Honor Walk will honor Roger Casement with an unveiling of a bronze plaque to be installed in the Castro District on October 28, 2025; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco does hereby designate October 28, 2025, as "Roger Casement Day" in his honor, to commemorate his legacy, his contributions to expose colonial atrocities, and his championing of self-determination and independence for all oppressed peoples.
